SUBJECT: Boeing South Carolina Workplace Return

Dear Boeing Supplier,

Boeing is undertaking a safe and orderly restart of 787 production operations in South Carolina beginning third shift May 3 and following through first and second shift May 4. The company has planned a responsible and measured approach to restarting production with a focus on health, safety, quality and meeting customer commitments. Those returning to work will support essential manufacturing, global transportation infrastructure and cargo services.

Initially, the resumption of targeted operations will involve teams that focus on:

- BSC site operations in support of 787 production
 - Airport Campus, Emergent Operations, Interiors Responsibility Center South Carolina and Propulsion
- Other essential labs and support teams will also resume to support critical program and customer needs

We will work with you to determine the right number of employees who should return to work or regularly visit our Boeing South Carolina sites. You will receive contractual direction from an authorized Boeing Procurement Agent, and please refer all specific business-related inquiries and information to your Boeing Procurement Agent.

The safety of everyone who visits our sites is our highest priority. Boeing has implemented physical distancing and cleanliness procedures that align with federal and state guidance. We have benchmarked other manufacturing companies and put measures in place to protect the health and safety of those who work at or visit our sites.

During the more than three-week suspension of BSC 787 production operations, the company cleaned its facilities and implemented enhanced health and safety procedures to protect teammates returning to work. Boeing employees who can telecommute must continue to do so unless instructed by their manager to return to work, in alignment with federal and state guidance.
