CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

- **1. FAR Clauses** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.
 - **52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures** (MAY 2014).  - (1) Item Description.
 - (2) Unique Identification Number (License Tag).
 - (3) Unit Price.
 - (4) An explanation of the data used to make the unique identification number.
 - (d) For items physically transferred under paragraph (a) the following additional data is required:
 - (1) Date originally placed in service.
 - (2) Item condition.
 - (3) Date last serviced.
 - (e) The data required in paragraphs (c) and (d) shall be delivered to the NASA center receiving activity listed below:

H. 21 ORGANIZATIONAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST DISCLOSURE (Applicable if your purchase order/subcontract is \$100,000 or more.)

- (a) Purpose. The purpose of this clause is to ensure that the contractor and its subcontractor's (1) are not biased because of their financial, contractual, organizational, or other interests which relate to the work under this contract, and (2) do not obtain any unfair competitive advantage over other parties by virtue of its performance of this contract.
- (b) Scope. The restrictions described herein shall apply to performance or participation by the contractor and any of its affiliates or successors in interest (hereinafter collectively referred to as "contractor") in the activities covered by this clause as a prime contractor, subcontractor, co-sponsor, joint venture, consultant, or in any similar capacity. For the purpose of this clause, affiliation occurs when a business concern is controlled by or has the power to control another or when a third party has the power to control both.
- (c) The contractor agrees that it shall make an immediate and full disclosure in writing to the NASA Contracting Officer and to the NOAA Contracting Officer, if both agencies are involved or if only one agency is involved then to the relevant agency, of any potential or actual organizational conflicts of interest that may cause a reasonably prudent person to question the contractor's impartiality because of bias or an unfair competitive advantage. Such disclosure shall include a description of any action which the contractor has taken or proposes to take to avoid, neutralize, or mitigate any resulting conflict of interest. The Government may, however, terminate the contract for convenience if it deems such termination to be in the best interest of the Government.
- (d) In the event the contractor was aware of facts required to be disclosed or the existence of an actual or potential organizational conflict of interest and did not disclose such facts or such conflict of interest to the Contracting Officer, the Contracting Officer may terminate this contract for default.
- (e) The Contractor represents that if it discovers an organizational conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest after award, a prompt and full disclosure shall be made in writing to the Contracting Officer. This disclosure shall include a description of the action the Contractor has taken or proposes to take in order to avoid, neutralize, or mitigate such conflicts. Such prompt and full description shall be required for each actual or potential OCI.
- (f) Subcontracts. (1) The contractor shall include a clause substantially similar to this clause, including paragraph (f), in subcontracts expected to exceed the simplified acquisition threshold determined in accordance with FAR Part 13. The terms "contract," "contractor," and "contracting officer" shall be appropriately modified to preserve the Government's rights.
- (g) The contractor shall obtain from its subcontractor or consultants the disclosure required in FAR Part 9.5.507-1, and shall determine in writing whether the interests disclosed present an actual or significant potential for an organizational conflict of interest. Where an actual or significant potential organizational conflict of interest is identified by the subcontractor, the subcontractor shall take actions to avoid, neutralize, or mitigate the organizational conflict to the satisfaction of the prime contractor. If the subcontractor's

organizational conflict cannot be avoided, neutralized, or mitigated then the prime contractor must obtain the written approval of the contracting officer prior to entering into the subcontract.

(h) Waiver. The parties recognize that this clause has potential effects which will survive the performance of this contract and that it is impossible to foresee each circumstance to which it might be applied in the future. Accordingly, the Contractor may at any time seek a waiver from the Head of the Contracting Activity by submitting such waiver request to the Contracting Officer by submitting a full written description of the requested waiver and the reasons in support thereof.

H.27 RELEASE OF DATA TO NOAA, NOAA'S SUPPORT CONTRACTORS AND NOAA'S CONTRACTORS FOR THE GROUND SYSTEM (Applicable for all purchase orders/subcontracts. "Contractor" means "Subcontractor" and "Contracting Officer" means "The Boeing Company.")

To accomplish GOES R series system requirements, NASA will provide data deliverable under this contract to the National Atmospheric and Oceanic Administration (NOAA), NOAA support contractors and NOAA's contractors for the Acquisition and Operations (A&O) phase of the GOES R Series Ground System..

NASA intends to provide NOAA, NOAA's support contractors and NOAA's A&O contractors with all requirements documents and other data submitted by the Contractor or otherwise produced under the contract. NOAA, NOAA's support contractors, and NOAA's A&O contractors will also attend reviews of the Contractor.

- (a) By submitting this proposal or performing this contract, the Contractor agrees that NASA may release the following data to NOAA, NOAA's support contractors and the NOAA A&O contractors under appropriate protected measures in furtherance of GOES R series system objectives:
- (i) Deliverable data that includes information or data identified by the Contractor as not currently in the public domain, that the Contractor has developed at private expense, that may embody trade secrets or commercial or financial information or other information or data that that may be sensitive or privileged, or otherwise marked as the Contractor's proprietary information.
- (ii) Deliverable data that includes data identified as Limited Rights Data in accordance with FAR 52.227-14, Rights in Data –General—Alternate II.
- (b) The Contractor shall establish non-disclosure agreements (NDAs) with the NOAA support contractors and the A&O contractors regarding the handling of any data identified in paragraph (a).
- (c) The Contracting Officer will provide a list of the current NOAA support contractors and their subcontractors that are supporting NOAA GOES R series activities. The Contracting Officer will provide changes to this list as necessary.
- (d) The Contractor shall insert this clause, including this paragraph, suitably modified to reflect the relationship of the parties, in all subcontracts that may require the furnishing of data as set forth in paragraph (a).
