CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

1. FAR Clauses The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

52.204-7 Central Contractor Registration (APR 2008). "Government" means Government except as otherwise stated herein. In paragraph (a) in the definition of Central Contractor Registration (CCR), "Government" means Government the first time it is used; "Government" means Buyer the second time it is used. In paragraph (a) in the definition of Data Universal Numbering System+4 (DUNS+4) number, establishing the 4-character suffix will not assist EFT from Buyer to Seller. In subparagraph (b)(2), "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. In the second sentence in subparagraph (c)(1)(ii), delete "for" and insert "under" in lieu thereof. In paragraph (d), "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. In paragraph (f), "Government?s" means "Buyer?s." Paragraph (g) is deleted.

52.204-10 Reporting Executive Compensation And First-Tier Subcontract Awards (JUL 2010). Delete all paragraphs except (b). Contractor means Buyer in paragraph (b). The "required information" in paragraph (b) that will be made public includes the information required as set forth in the deleted paragraphs.

52.209-6 Protecting the Government's Interests When Subcontracting With Contractors Debarred, Suspended or Proposed for Debarment (DEC 2010). Seller agrees it is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. Seller shall disclose to Buyer, in writing, whether as of the time of award of this contract, Seller or its principals is or is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government.

52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements (APR 2008). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.

52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (FEB 1999).

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (MAR 2007).

52.222-41 Service Contract Act of 1965 (NOV 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the Act.

52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons (FEB 2009). In paragraph (d), the term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term "the Government" means Buyer.

52.223-18 Encouraging Contractor Policies To Ban Text Messaging While Driving (AUG 2011).

52.225-13 Restriction on Certain Foreign Purchases (JUN 2008).

52.245-1 Government Property (AUG 2010). This clause applies only if Government property is acquired or furnished for contract performance. "Government" shall mean Government throughout except the first time it appears in paragraph (g)(1) when "Government" shall mean the Government or the Buyer. Paragraph (h)(1) is deleted and replaced by the following: "Seller assumes the

risk of, and shall be responsible for, any loss, damage, destruction, or theft of Government property upon its delivery to Seller as Government-furnished property. However, Seller is not responsible for reasonable wear and tear to Government Property or for Government property properly consumed in performing this contract.” If the contract incorporates Boeing General Provision GP4, the Government-Owned Property article in GP4 is hereby deleted.

2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

252.203-7000 Requirements Relating to Compensation of Former DoD Officials. (JAN 2009).

252.204-7008 Requirements for Contracts Involving Export-Controlled Items. (APR 2010).

252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payments Program (JAN 2009).

252.225-7002 Qualifying Country Sources as Subcontractors (APR 2003).

252.237-7010 Prohibition On Interrogation Of Detainees By Contractor Personnel (NOV 2010). This clause applies if the contract requires Seller's personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

3. Commercial Items If goods or services being procured under this contract are commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:

52.209-6 Protecting the Government's Interests When Subcontracting With Contractors Debarred, Suspended or Proposed for Debarment (DEC 2010). Seller agrees it is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. Seller shall disclose to Buyer, in writing, whether as of the time of award of this contract, Seller or its principals is or is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government.

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (MAR 2007).

52.222-41 Service Contract Act of 1965 (NOV 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the Act.

52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons (FEB 2009). In paragraph (d), the term “Contracting Officer” means Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term “the Government” means Buyer.

52.223-18 Encouraging Contractor Policies To Ban Text Messaging While Driving (AUG 2011).

252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payments Program (JAN 2009).

252.237-7010 Prohibition On Interrogation Of Detainees By Contractor Personnel (NOV 2010). This clause applies if the contract requires Seller's personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.
