**CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS**

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

**1. FAR Clauses** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

**52.203-15 Whistleblower Protections Under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009** (JUN 2010). This clause applies if this contract is funded in whole or in part with Recovery Act funds.

**52.204-2 Security Requirements** (AUG 1996). Changes clause means the changes clause of this contract. This clause applies only if access to classified material is required.

**52.204-7 Central Contractor Registration** (APR 2008).

"Government" means Government except as otherwise stated herein. In paragraph (a) in the definition of Central Contractor Registration (CCR), "Government" means Government the first time it is used; "Government" means Buyer the second time it is used. In paragraph (a) in the definition of Data Universal Numbering System+4 (DUNS+4) number, establishing the 4-character suffix will not assist EFT from Buyer to Seller. In subparagraph (b)(2), "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. In the second sentence in subparagraph (c)(1)(ii), delete "for" and insert "under" in lieu thereof. In paragraph (d), "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. In paragraph (f), "Government's" means "Buyer's." Paragraph (g) is deleted.

**52.204-9 Personal Identity Verification of Contractor Personnel.** (JAN 2011). This clause applies only if performance under this contract requires Seller to have routine physical access to a Federally-controlled facility and/or routine access to a Federally-controlled information system.

**52.211-5 Material Requirements** (AUG 2000). Any notice will be given to Buyer rather than the Contracting Officer.

**52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements** (APR 2008). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.

**52.215-2 Audit and Records - Negotiation** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$150,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types; (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.

**52.215-10 Price Reduction for Defective Certified Cost or Pricing Data** (AUG 2011). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. In subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a), insert "of this contract" after "price or cost." In Paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

**52.215-11 Price Reduction for Defective Certified Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications** (AUG 2011). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" means "Government" or "Buyer." In Paragraph (e), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

**52.215-12 Subcontractor Certified Cost or Pricing Data** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."

**52.215-13 Subcontractor Certified Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (c) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."

**52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions** (OCT 2010). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(g).

**52.215-18 Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Post-Retirement Benefits (PRB) Other Than Pensions** (JUL 2005). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(j).

**52.215-19 Notification of Ownership Changes** (OCT 1997). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(k).

**52.215-21 Requirement for Certified Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Certified Cost and Pricing Data - Modifications** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**52.215-21 Requirement for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost and Pricing Data - Modifications** (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns** (JAN 2011).

**52.219-9 Small-Business Subcontracting Plan** (JAN 2011).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$650,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. Seller shall adopt a subcontracting plan that complies with the requirements of this clause. In addition, Seller shall submit to Buyer Form X31162, Small and Small Disadvantaged Business and Women-Owned Small Business Subcontracting Plan Certificate of Compliance. In accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(iv), Seller agrees that it will submit the ISR and/or SSR using eSRS, and, in accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(vi), Seller agrees to provide the prime contract number, its own DUNS number, and the email address of Seller's official responsible for acknowledging or rejecting the ISRs, to its subcontractors with subcontracting plans.

**52.222-1 Notice to the Government of Labor Disputes** (FEB 1997). Contracting Officer shall mean Buyer.

**52.222-20 Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

**52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities** (FEB 1999).

**52.222-26 Equal Opportunity** (MAR 2007).

**52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Veterans.** (SEP 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is \$100,000 or more.

**52.222-36 Affirmative Action For Workers With Disabilities** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

**52.222-37 Employment Reports on Veterans** (SEP 2010). This clause applies if this contract is \$100,000 or more.

**52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons** (FEB 2009). In paragraph (d), the term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term "the Government" means Buyer.

**52.223-2 Affirmative Procurement of Biobased Products Under Service and Construction Contracts** (DEC 2007).

**52.223-11 Ozone Depleting Substances** (MAY 2001).

**52.223-15 Energy Efficiency In Energy-Consuming Products** (DEC 2007).

**52.223-18 Encouraging Contractor Policies To Ban Text Messaging While Driving** (AUG 2011).

**52.224-2 Privacy Act** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if Seller is required to design, develop, or operate a system of records contemplated by this clause.

**52.225-5 Trade Agreements** (NOV 2011).

Delete the first two sentences in (b) and substitute the following in lieu thereof: "The WTO, GPA and FTAs apply to all items ordered in this contract."

**52.225-13 Restriction on Certain Foreign Purchases** (JUN 2008).

**52.227-9 Refund of Royalties** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if the amount of royalties reported during negotiation of this contract exceeds \$250.

**52.227-11 Patent Rights -- Ownership by the Contractor** (DEC 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

**52.234-1 Industrial Resources Developed Under Defense Production Act Title III** (DEC 1994).

**52.237-2 Protection of Government Buildings, Equipment, and Vegetation** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if work will be performed on a Government installation. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items** (DEC 2010).

**52.245-1 Government Property** (AUG 2010).

This clause applies only if Government property is acquired or furnished for contract performance. "Government" shall mean Government throughout except the first time it appears in paragraph (g)(1) when "Government" shall mean the Government or the Buyer. Paragraph (h)(1) is deleted and replaced by the following: "Seller assumes the risk of, and shall be responsible for, any loss, damage, destruction, or theft of Government property upon its delivery to Seller as Government-furnished property. However, Seller is

not responsible for reasonable wear and tear to Government Property or for Government property properly consumed in performing this contract." If the contract incorporates Boeing General Provision GP4, the Government-Owned Property article in GP4 is hereby deleted.

**2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses** DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

**252.203-7000 Requirements Relating to Compensation of Former DoD Officials.** (JAN 2009).

**252.203-7001 Prohibition on Persons Convicted of Fraud or Other Defense-Contract-Related Felonies** (DEC 2008).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold and is not for the purchase of commercial items or commercial components. Except in paragraph (a), "this contract" and "the contract" mean the contract between Buyer and Seller. In subparagraph (d)(2), delete the words "or first-tier subcontractor." In paragraph (e), the remedies described in subparagraphs (2) and (3) are available to Buyer, not the Government. In paragraph (f), "through the Buyer" is inserted after "Contracting Officer." Paragraph (g) is deleted.

**252.204-7000 Disclosure of Information** (DEC 1991). Seller will submit requests for authorization to release through Buyer. Seller shall submit written requests to Buyer a minimum of 60 days prior to proposed date of release.

**252.204-7008 Requirements for Contracts Involving Export-Controlled Items.** (APR 2010).

**252.211-7000 Acquisition Streamlining** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$1.5 million.

**252.211-7003 Item Identification and Valuation** (JUN 2011).

This clause applies if Buyer has made known to Seller that it is acquiring by this contract any item for which unique item identification is required in accordance with paragraph (c) (1) of this clause.

**252.215-7000 Pricing Adjustments** (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4.

**252.219-7003 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts)** (SEP 2011). Except paragraph (g) which is hereby deleted.

**252.223-7006 Prohibition on Storage and Disposal of Toxic and Hazardous Materials** (APR 1993).

**252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payments Program** (OCT 2011).

**252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payments Program Deviation** (JUL 2009).

**252.225-7002 Qualifying Country Sources as Subcontractors** (APR 2003).

**252.225-7008 Restriction on Acquisition of Specialty Metals** (JUL 2009). This clause applies if the contract exceeds \$150,000.

**252.225-7997 Additional Requirements and Responsibilities Relating to Alleged Crimes by or Against Contractor Personnel Deviation** (AUG 2010). This clause applies if the contract involves work to be performed in Iraq or Afghanistan for a period of longer than 14 days.

**252.227-7013 Rights In Technical Data -- Noncommercial Items** (SEP 2011).

**252.227-7014 Rights In Noncommercial Computer Software And Noncommercial Computer Software Documentation** (MAR 2011). This clause applies only if the delivery of noncommercial computer software or noncommercial computer documentation may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

**252.227-7015 Technical Data -- Commercial Items** (DEC 2011).

**252.227-7016 Rights in Bid or Proposal Information** (JAN 2011).

**252.227-7017 Identification and Assertion of Use, Release, or Disclosure Restrictions** (JAN 2011).

**252.227-7019 Validation of Asserted Restrictions - Computer Software** (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if computer software may be originated, developed, or delivered under this contract.

**252.227-7027 Deferred Ordering of Technical Data or Computer Software** (APR 1988). This clause applies only if technical data or computer software may be generated as part of the performance of this contract.

**252.227-7030 Technical Data -- Withholding of Payment** (MAR 2000). In this clause, "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

**252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data** (SEP 2011).

**252.227-7038 PATENT RIGHTS—OWNERSHIP BY THE CONTRACTOR (LARGE BUSINESS)** (DEC 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is not a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

**252.227-7038 Patent Rights-Ownership by the Contractor (Large Business) Alternate II** (DEC 2007).

**252.228-7001 Ground and Flight Risk** (JUN 2010).

**252.231-7000 Supplemental Cost Principles** (DEC 1991).

**252.232-7004 DoD Progress Payment Rates** (OCT 2001). This clause applies if progress payments are authorized under this contract.

**252.234-7001 Notice of Earned Value Management System** (APR 2008). This clause applies only if 252.234-7002 is applicable.

**252.234-7002 Earned Value Management System** (MAY 2011).

With the exception of paragraphs (i) and (j), Seller shall comply with EVMS requirements if Seller is identified to comply elsewhere in this contract.

**252.235-7003 Frequency Authorization** (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract requires the development, production, construction, testing, or operation of a device for which a radio frequency authorization is required.

**252.235-7003 Frequency Authorization Alternate I** (DEC 1991).

**252.235-7004 PROTECTION OF HUMAN SUBJECTS** (JUL 2009). In subparagraph (c)(1), HRPO means HRPO and Buyer; "with a copy to the Contracting Officer" is deleted; "from the Contracting Officer" is deleted; and in the last sentence, Contracting Officer means Buyer. In subparagraph (c)(2) HRPO means HRPO and Buyer; "with a copy to the Contracting Officer" is deleted and "from the Contracting Officer" is deleted. In paragraph (e), "under Federal Acquisition Regulation clause 52.242-15" is deleted and Contracting Officer means Buyer.

**252.237-7010 PROHIBITION ON INTERROGATION OF DETAINEES BY CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL** (NOV 2010). This clause applies if the contract requires Seller's personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

**252.239-7016 Telecommunications Security Equipment, Devices, Techniques, and Services** (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract requires securing telecommunications.

**252.243-7001 Pricing of Contract Modifications** (DEC 1991).

**252.245-7001 TAGGING, LABELING, AND MARKING OF GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY** (FEB 2011). Contractor shall include this clause in all subcontracts under which Seller acquires any serially-managed items.

**252.246-7001 Warranty of Data** (DEC 1991). The warranty period in paragraph (b) is three years from the Government's acceptance of the final items of data under this contract. "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**252.246-7001 Warranty of Data Alternate I** (DEC 1991). The warranty period in paragraph (b) is three years from the Government's acceptance of the final items of data under this contract. "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**252.246-7001 Warranty of Data Alternate II** (DEC 1991). The warranty period in paragraph (b) is three years from the Government's acceptance of the final items of data under this contract. "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea** (MAY 2002). This clause applies only if the supplies are of a type described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (d), "45 days" is changed to "60 days." In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold. Paragraphs (f) and (g) are excluded.

**252.249-7002 Notification Of Anticipated Contract Termination Or Reduction** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is \$650,000 or more. Seller will comply with the notice and flowdown requirements of paragraph (d)(2) of the referenced clause.

**252.251-7000 Ordering From Government Supply Sources** (NOV 2004). This clause applies only if Seller is notified by Buyer that Seller is authorized to purchase from Government supply sources in the performance of this contract.

**3. Commercial Items** If goods or services being procured under this contract are commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:

**52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns** (JAN 2011).

**52.222-26 Equal Opportunity** (MAR 2007).

**52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Veterans.** (SEP 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is \$100,000 or more.

**52.222-36 Affirmative Action For Workers With Disabilities** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

**52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons** (FEB 2009). In paragraph (d), the term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term "the Government" means Buyer.

**252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payments Program Alternate I** (OCT 2011).

**4. AFFARS Clauses** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Air Force Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" means Seller.

**5352.201-9101 Ombudsman** (APR 2010).

**5352.204-9000 Notification of Government Security Activity and Visitor Group Security Agreements** (APR 2003).

(In this clause, "contractor" means Seller.)

This contract contains a [DD Form 254](#), DOD Contract Security Classification Specification, and requires performance at a government location in the U.S. or overseas. Prior to beginning operations involving classified information on an installation identified on the [DD Form 254](#), the contractor shall take the following actions:

(a) At least thirty days prior to beginning operations, notify the security police activity shown in the distribution block of the [DD Form 254](#) as to:

- (1) The name, address, and telephone number of this contract company's representative and designated alternate in the U.S. or overseas area, as appropriate;
- (2) The contract number and military contracting command;
- (3) The highest classification category of defense information to which contractor employees will have access;
- (4) The Air Force installations in the U.S. (in overseas areas, identify only the APO number(s)) where the contract work will be performed;
- (5) The date contractor operations will begin on base in the U.S. or in the overseas area;
- (6) The estimated completion date of operations on base in the U.S. or in the overseas area; and,
- (7) Any changes to information previously provided under this clause.

This requirement is in addition to visit request procedures contained in [DOD 5220.22-M](#), National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual.

(b) Prior to beginning operations involving classified information on an installation identified on the [DD Form 254](#) where the contractor is not required to have a facility security clearance, the contractor shall enter into a Visitor Group Security Agreement (or understanding) with the installation commander to ensure that the contractor's security procedures are properly integrated with those of the installation. As a minimum, the agreement shall identify the security actions that will be performed:

- (1) By the installation for the contractor, such as providing storage and classified reproduction facilities, guard services, security forms, security inspections under [DOD 5220.22-M](#), classified mail services, security badges, visitor control, and investigating security incidents; and
- (2) Jointly by the contractor and the installation, such as packaging and addressing classified transmittals, security checks, internal security controls, and implementing emergency procedures to protect classified material.

**5352.223-9000 Elimination of Use of Class I Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS)** (APR 2003).

**5352.223-9001 Health and Safety on Government Installations** (JUN 1997).

**5352.242-9000 Contractor Access to Air Force Installations** (AUG 2007).

(This clause applies only if Seller will require access to an Air Force installation. Seller's written request for access to an Air Force installation shall be submitted through Buyer.)

- (a) The contractor shall obtain base identification and vehicle passes, if required, for all contractor personnel who make frequent visits to or perform work on the Air Force installation(s) cited in the contract. Contractor personnel are required to wear or prominently display installation identification badges or contractor-furnished, contractor identification badges while visiting or performing work on

the installation.

(b) The contractor shall submit a written request on company letterhead to the contracting officer listing the following: contract number, location of work site, start and stop dates, and names of employees and subcontractor employees needing access to the base. The letter will also specify the individual(s) authorized to sign for a request for base identification credentials or vehicle passes. The contracting officer will endorse the request and forward it to the issuing base pass and registration office or security police for processing. When reporting to the registration office, the authorized contractor individual(s) should provide a valid driver's license, current vehicle registration, valid vehicle insurance certificate, and Contract letter to obtain a vehicle pass.

(c) During performance of the contract, the contractor shall be responsible for obtaining required identification for newly assigned personnel and for prompt return of credentials and vehicle passes for any employee who no longer requires access to the work site.

(d) When work under this contract requires unescorted entry to controlled or restricted areas, the contractor shall comply with base directives.

(e) Upon completion or termination of the contract or expiration of the identification passes, the prime contractor shall ensure that all base identification passes issued to employees and subcontractor employees are returned to the issuing office. (f) Failure to comply with these requirements may result in withholding of final payment.

#### **5352.242-9001 Common Access Cards (CACs) for Contractor Personnel (AUG 2004).**

**5. AFMC Clauses** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Air Force Material Command Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" means Seller.

#### **H-012 DELIVERY & LICENSE RIGHTS FOR TECHNICAL DATA & COMPUTER SOFTWARE NECESSARY FOR MAINTENANCE Deviation (NOV 2011).**

(a) Definitions. As used in this special contract requirement and associated CLINs

1. The term "depot level maintenance" and "organizational level maintenance" as used in this contract-

A. Includes, but is not limited to- (i) Installation, inspection, localization, isolation, disassembly, interchange, repair, reassembly, alignment, and checkout; and

(ii) Maintenance performed on materiel requiring repair or major overhaul and including modification, testing, and reclamation.

B. Does not include the design or manufacture of new items.

2. Technical Data Package as used in this contract is defined as all computer software and technical data (including computer software documentation) necessary for operation, maintenance, installation or training purposes (other than detailed manufacturing or process data) pertaining to the KC-46 aircrew training system (ATS) and equipment, associated with its life cycle support.

3. Other terms used in this special contract requirement that are defined in the following clauses have the same meaning as set forth in those clauses:

A. DFARS 252.227-7013;

B. DFARS 252.227-7014; and

C. DFARS 252.227-7015.

(b) Delivery Requirements. The contractor shall deliver all technical data (including computer software documentation) and computer software necessary for organizational and depot level maintenance of the entire KC-46 ATS and equipment. In addition, the contractor shall deliver all technical data (including computer software documentation) and computer software necessary to develop a Government owned System Integration Laboratory (SIL) .

1. General. The contractor shall provide the technical data and computer software having the characteristics (e.g., content, format, and delivery medium) necessary for organizational and depot level maintenance as determined and required by the Government. The Government will require that such technical data or computer software include-

A. No less information or detail than industry standards, nor less than the contractor typically requires, to perform such maintenance activities; and

B. Additional information or detail that is necessary for military purposes related to organizational and depot level maintenance.

2. Organizational Level and Depot Level Maintenance Technical Data and Computer Software. The technical data (including computer software documentation) and computer software described in this order must provide a complete package of all technical data (including computer software documentation) and computer software necessary for the Government to perform organizational and depot level maintenance for the entire KC-46 aircrew training system and equipment, including all systems, subsystems, and components without exception. This includes technical data and computer software necessary for installation and de-installation, and disassembly and reassembly, at the lowest practicable segregable level that does not require detailed manufacturing or process information. Examples of technical data and computer software that are needed to perform organizational and depot level maintenance include, but are not limited to, the following:

A. Detailed aircrew training devices (ATDs) technical data and information;



- B. Organizational and Depot level maintenance technical data and information regarding all systems, subsystems, and components;
- C. Interface Control Documents (ICDs); and
- D. Computer software and computer software documentation necessary to perform organizational level and depot level maintenance on computer programs.

(c) License Rights. Pursuant to the contract clauses and regulations governing rights in technical data and computer software (DFARS 227.7202, 252.227-7013, 252.227-7014, and 252.227-7015), the Government is granted certain defined rights in all technical data (including computer software documentation) and computer software developed or delivered under this contract. The parties are also allowed to negotiate special license agreements, subject to certain limitations below.

1. Identification and Assertion of Restrictions. If the contractor (including its subcontractors or suppliers at any tier) desires to provide the Government with less than Unlimited Rights in any technical data or computer software, that technical data and computer software must have been identified. The license rights identified in the list(s) for technical data and computer software for organizational and depot level maintenance shall provide the

Government (including its support contractors) with all rights necessary to perform organizational and depot level maintenance including at least those minimum rights specified for these purposes below.

2. Government's License Rights. Subject to the rights and obligations referenced below, the Government shall have the following license rights:

A. Pursuant to the contract clauses governing rights in technical data and computer software, the Government is granted Unlimited Rights in all technical data (including computer software documentation) that is necessary for operation, maintenance (including organizational and depot level maintenance), installation, or training. However, for such technical data or computer software related to items developed exclusively or partially at private expense, the Government is willing to accept less than Unlimited Rights in such technical data or computer software, as long as the Government obtains rights sufficient for organizational and depot level maintenance activities by the Government (including its support contractors), as specified below.

B. If the contractor provides the Government with less than Unlimited Rights in such technical data or computer software related to items developed exclusively or partially at private expense, the Government shall have at least the following rights in all technical data and computer software necessary for organizational and depot level maintenance:

(i) For noncommercial technical data, all rights included in Limited Rights (DFARS 252.227-7013(a)(13)) and all rights specified below; and for commercial technical data, all rights specified at DFARS 252.227-7015(b)(2), all rights specified below, and all additional rights contained in any license customarily provided to the public.

(ii) For noncommercial computer software, all rights specified below and all rights included in Restricted Rights (DFARS 252.227-7014(a)(14)); and for commercial computer software, all rights specified below and all additional rights contained in any license customarily provided to the public.

(iii) In addition to the rights specified herein, and subject to the protections herein, the right to release or disclose all such technical data or computer software outside the Government, and to authorize the recipient of such information to use, modify, release, perform, display, or disclose the technical data or computer software for the sole purpose of supporting any and all Organizational and depot level maintenance activities for the KC-46 ATS.

(iv) Unless authorized in writing by the party asserting restrictions on such technical data or computer software, the Government and its contractors may not use such technical data or computer software to manufacture additional quantities of any item or for any commercial purpose.

3. All contractors or other persons receiving technical data or computer software as authorized above shall be subject to a legal prohibition (e.g., nondisclosure agreement) against using such technical data and computer software for any purpose other than supporting the Government's organizational and depot level maintenance activities, as appropriate and authorized, for the KC-46 ATS and equipment.

(d) Technical Data and Computer Software of Subcontractors and Suppliers. The contractor's obligations in this clause shall apply to all technical data and computer software, including all technical data or computer software developed, delivered, or otherwise provided by subcontractors or suppliers at any tier, and regardless of whether the computer software or technical data is or relates to commercial items or noncommercial items. The contractor shall include these requirements in its subcontracts or other contractual or legal instruments with its subcontractors or suppliers at any tier.

(e) Validation of Asserted Restrictions and Restrictive Markings. Nothing in this special contract requirement limits or otherwise affects the parties' rights or obligations specified in the DFARS 252.227-7019 or DFARS 252.227-7037.

#### **6. Prime Contract Special Provisions** The following prime contract special provisions apply to this purchase order

**TBD NOTIFICATION OF DEBARMENT/SUSPENSION AND EXPORT DATA CONTROL** (AUG 2009). Seller shall provide immediate notice to Buyer in the event of being debarred suspended, or proposed for debarment by any Federal Agency during the

performance of this contract.

(1) For the purpose of this clause,

(A) Foreign person is any person who is not a citizen of the or lawfully admitted to the for permanent residence under the Immigration and Nationality Act, and includes foreign corporations, foreign organizations, and foreign governments;

(B) Foreign representative is anyone, regardless of nationality or citizenship, acting as an agent, representative, official, or employee of a foreign government, a foreign-owned or influenced firm, corporation, or person; and

(C) Foreign sources are those sources (vendors, subcontractors, and suppliers) owned and controlled by a foreign person.

(2) Seller shall place a clause in subcontracts containing appropriate export control restrictions, set forth in this clause.

(3) Nothing in this clause waives any requirement imposed by any other U.S. Government agency with respect to employment of foreign nationals or export-controlled data and information.

(4) Equipment and technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract are controlled by the International Traffic in Arms Regulation (ITAR), 22 CFR Sections 121 through 128. An export license is required before assigning any foreign source to perform work under this contract or before granting access to foreign persons to any equipment and technical data generated or delivered during performance (see 22 CFR Section 125). Seller shall notify Buyer and obtain the written approval of Buyer prior to assigning or granting access to any work, equipment, or technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract to foreign persons or their representatives. This notification shall include the name and country of origin of the foreign person or representative, the specific work, equipment, or data to which the person will have access, and whether the foreign person is cleared to have access to technical data (DoD 5220.22-M, National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM)).
