### CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

- 1. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.
  - 52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
  - 52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures (excluding subparagraph (c)(1)) (JUL 1995). Buyer may withhold sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
  - 52.203-11 Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (APR 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
  - 52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (JUN 1997). This clause applies only if this Contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (c)(4) is modified to read as follows: "(c)(4) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor.
  - 52.204-2 Security Requirements (AUG 1996). "Changes clause" means the changes clause of this contract. This clause applies only if access to classified material is required.
  - 52.211-5 New Material (AUG 2000). Any notice will be given to Buyer rather than the Contracting Officer.
  - 52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements (SEP 1990). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.
  - 52.215-2 Audit and Records Negotiation (JUN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types: (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.
  - 52.215-10 Price Reduction For Defective Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and is not otherwise exempt. In subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a), insert "of this contract" after "price or cost." In Paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."
  - 52.215-12 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall

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be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "The Boeing Company or any of its wholly owned subsidiaries."

- 52.215-14 Integrity of Unit Prices (excluding subparagraph (b)) (OCT 1997). This clause applies except for contracts at or below \$100,000; construction or architect-engineer services under FAR Part 36; utility services under FAR Part 41; services where supplies are not required; commercial items; and petroleum products.
- 52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions (DEC 1998). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(g).
- 52.215-18 Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Postretirement Benefits Other Than Pensions (PRB) (OCT 1997). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(j).
- 52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (OCT 2000).
- 52.219-9 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (OCT 1999). In paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000. and Seller is not a small business concern.
- 52.222-1 Notice to Government of Labor Disputes (FEB 1997). "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.222-20 Walsh-Healy Public Contracts Act (DEC 1996). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10.000.
- 52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (FEB 1999).
- 52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b)(1) through (11)) (FEB 1999).
- 52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (APR 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.
- 52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Workers With Disabilities (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$ 10,000.
- 52.222-37 Employment Reports on Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (JAN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.
- 52.223-3 Hazardous Material Identification and Material Safety Data (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.
- 52.223-7 Notice of Radioactive Materials (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract involves (i) radioactive material requiring specific licensing under the regulations issued pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, as set forth in Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations, in effect on the date of this contract, or (ii) other radioactive material not requiring specific licensing in which the specific activity is greater than 0.002 microcuries per gram or the activity per item equals or exceeds 0.01 microcuries. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. In the blank in paragraph (a), insert "60 days."
- 52.223-11 Ozone Depleting Substances (JUN 1996).
- 52.223-14 Toxic Chemical Release Reporting (excluding subparagraph (e)) (OCT 2000). This clause applies only if this contract is not for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, was competitively awarded, and exceeds \$100,000 (including all options).
- 52.225-8 Duty-free Entry (FEB 2000). This clause applies only if this contract identifies supplies to be afforded duty-free entry or if foreign supplies in excess of \$10,000 may be imported into the customs territory of the

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United States. For the purposes of this clause, the blanks in paragraph (g)(3) are completed as follows: UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, Duty-free entry is claimed pursuant Section XXII, Chapter 98, Subchapter VIII, Item No. 9808.00.30 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States. Upon arrival of shipment at port of entry, the importer or authorized agent will notify Commander, Defense Contract Management Area Operations (DCMAO, New York, 201 Varick Street, New York, New York, 10014-4811, Attention DCRN-NCT) for execution of Customs Forms 7501, 7501-A, or 7506 and required duty free entry certificates.

- 52.225-13 Restrictions on Certain Foreign Purchases (JUL 2000).
- 52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (JUL 1995).
- 52.227-1 Alternate I (APR 1984).
- 52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement (AUG 1996). A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer". This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- 52.227-10 Filing of Patent Applications Classified Subject Matter (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract will involve access to classified information.
- 52.227-12 Patent Rights Retention by the Contractor (Long Form) (JUN 1997). This clause only applies if this Contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is other than a small business firm or nonprofit organization.
- 52.228-5 Insurance Work on a Government Installation (JAN 1997). Seller shall provide and maintain insurance as set forth in this contract.
- 52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (NOV 1999). Add "Buyer and the" before "Contracting Officer in paragraph (f). This provision applies if Clause H001, H002 or H004 is included in Buyer's contract.
- 52.234-1 Industrial Resources Developed Under Defense Production Act Title III (DEC 1994).
- 52.237-2 Protection of Government Buildings, Equipment, and Vegetation (APR 1984). This clause applies only if work will be performed on a Government installation. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.242-15 Stop Work Order (AUG 1989). Change "90 days" and "30 days" to "100 days" and "20 days" respectively. The terms "Contracting Officer" and "Government" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.244-5 Competition in Subcontracting (DEC 1996)
- 52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (OCT 1998)
- 52.245-2 Government Property (Fixed Price Contracts) (DEC 1989). This clause is not applicable if this contract incorporates Form GP4. "Government" shall mean Government throughout except the first time it appears in paragraph (f) when "Government" shall mean the Government or the Buyer.
- 52.245-17 Special Tooling (APR 1984). This clause applies only if tooling is acquired for or furnished by the Government and to be retained for use by the Seller.
- 52.245-18 Special Test Equipment (FEB 1993). Change "30 days" to "45 days" in paragraph (b) and (c). The notice of intent to procure special test equipment required by this clause shall be forwarded to the Buyer.
- 52.247-63 Preference for U.S.-Flag Air Carriers (JAN 1997). This clause only applies if this contract involves international air transportation.

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2. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

252.203-7001 Prohibition on Persons Convicted of Fraud or Other Defense-Contract Related Felonies (excluding paragraph (g)) (MAR 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and does not apply to the purchase of commercial items or commercial components. "Contractor" and "contract" are not changed in paragraphs (a) and (b). In paragraph (e), "Government" shall mean Government or Buyer. In paragraph (f), "through the Buyer" is inserted after "Contracting Officer". Paragraph (g) is deleted and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Contracting Officer.

252.204-7000 Disclosure of Information (DEC 1991). Seller will submit requests for authorization to release through Buyer.

252.209-7000 Acquisition From Subcontractors Subject to On-site Inspection Under the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and does not apply to the purchase of commercial items or commercial components.

252.211-7000 Acquisition Streamlining (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$1 million.

252.215-7000 Pricing Adjustments (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000.

252.223-7001 Hazard Warning Labels (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.

252.223-7002 Safety Precautions for Ammunition and Explosives (MAY 1994). This clause applies only if this contract involves ammunition or explosives. "Government" means Government or Buyer in paragraph (b)(2), each time it appears in (e), (f)(1), (f)(2), the first time it appears in (g)(1)(i), and in (g)(3). "Government" means Buyer in paragraphs (c)(3), (c)(4), (c)(5), and the second time it appears in (g)(1)(i). "Contracting Officer" means Contracting Officer and Buyer in paragraph (g)(4). "Contracting Officer" means Buyer in paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(2), (c)(3), (c)(4), (c)(5), and each time it appears in (d).

252.223-7003 Change in Place of Performance – Ammunition and Explosives (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if DFARS 252.223-7002 is applicable to this contract. The term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer.

252.223-7006 Prohibition on Storage and Disposal of Toxic and Hazardous Materials (APR 1993), <u>Alternate I</u> (NOV 1995). This clause applies to this contract if it requires, may require, or permits Seller to treat or dispose of non-DoD-owned toxic or hazardous materials as defined in this clause.

252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payment Program. (MAR 1998)

252.225-7002 Qualifying Country Sources as Subcontractors (DEC 1991)

252.225-7009 Duty-free Entry — Qualifying Country Supplies (End Products and Components) (AUG 2000).

252.225-7010 Duty-free Entry — Additional Provisions (AUG 2000). This clause applies in addition to FAR 52.225-10. The required information will be provided upon request.

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (AUG 2000).

252.225-7014 Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals (MAR 1998), Alternate I (MAR 1998).

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252.225-7016 Restriction on Acquisition of Ball and Roller Bearings (DEC 2000). This clause does not apply to the purchase of commercial items other than ball or roller bearings or to items which contain no ball or roller bearings.

252.225-7024 Restriction on Night Vision Intensifier Tubes and Devices (DEC 1991).

252.225-7025 Restriction on Acquisition of Forgings (JUN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract is for goods that contain restricted forging items per paragraphs (a) and (b) of the referenced clause.

252.225-7026 Reporting of Contract Performance Outside the United States (JUN 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and is not for commercial items, construction, ores, natural gases, utilities, petroleum products and crudes, timber (logs), or subsistence.

252.227-7013 Rights in Technical Data - Noncommercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for noncommercial items under this contract.

252.227-7014 Rights in Noncommercial Computer Software and Noncommercial Computer Software Documentation (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of noncommercial computer software or noncommercial computer documentation may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7015 Technical Data - Commercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for commercial items under this contract.

252.227-7016 Rights in Bid or Proposal Information (JUN 1995).

252.227-7019 Validation of Asserted Restrictions - Computer Software (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if computer software may be originated, developed, or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7026 Deferred Delivery of Technical Data or Computer Software (APR 1988). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required or if computer software may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7027 Deferred Ordering of Technical Data or Computer Software (APR 1988). This clause applies only if technical data or computer software may be generated as part of the performance of this contract.

252.227-7030 Technical Data - Withholding of Payment (MAR 2000). In this clause, "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

252.227-7036 Declaration of Technical Data Conformity (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required by this contract.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 1999). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required by this contract.

252.228-7005 Accident Reporting and Investigation Involving Aircraft, Missiles, and Space Launch Vehicles (DEC 1991).

252.231-7000 Supplemental Cost Principles (DEC 1991)

252.235-7003 Frequency Authorization (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract requires the development, production, construction, testing, or operation of a device for which a radio frequency authorization is required.

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252.239-7000 Protection Against Compromising Emanations (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if computer equipment or systems that will be used to process classified information will be delivered under this contract.

252.244-7000 Subcontracts for Commercial Items and Commercial Components (DoD Contracts) (MAR 2000).

252.245-7001 Reports of Government Property (MAY 1994). Seller will provide information that the Buyer may require to complete Buyer's annual report.

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). This clause applies only if the supplies are of a type described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (d), "45 days" is changed to "60 days." In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer. If this contract is at or below \$100,000, paragraphs (f) and (g) are excluded.

252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). "Contracting Officer" and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), "Contractor" mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

252.249-7002 Notification of Proposed Program Termination or Reduction (DEC 1996). This clause applies only if this contact is \$500,000 or more. Seller will comply with the notice and flowdown requirements of paragraph (d)(2) of the referenced clause.

252.251-7000 Ordering From Government Supply Sources (OCT 2002). This clause applies only if Seller is notified by Buyer that Seller is authorized to purchase from Government supply sources in the performance of this contract.

- 3. If goods or services being procured under this contract are for commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:
  - 52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b)(1) through (11)) (FEB 1999).
  - 52.222-35 Affirmative Action for Special Disabled and Vietnam Era Veterans (APR 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.
  - 52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Handicapped Workers (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.
  - 252.225-7014, Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals (MAR 1998), Alternate I (MAR 1998).
  - 252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and are a type of supplies described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (c), "45 days" is changed to "60 days". In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer.

252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). "Contracting Officer" and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), "Contractor" mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or

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forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

## 4. Cost Accounting Standards

- (1) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H001). The version of FAR 52.230-2, Cost Accounting Standards, incorporated by clause H001 is the version dated April 1998.
- (2) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H002). The version of FAR 52.230-3, Disclosure and Consistency of Cost Accounting Practices, incorporated by clause H002 is the version dated April 1998.
- (3) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H004). The version of FAR 52.230-5, Cost Accounting Standards Educational Institution, incorporated by clause H004 is the version dated April 1998.
- 5. The following prime contract special provisions apply to this purchase order:

#### A. NOTIFICATION OF DEBARMENT/SUSPENSION STATUS

Seller shall provide immediate notice to Buyer in the event of being debarred suspended, or proposed for debarment by any Federal Agency during the performance of this Contract.

#### B. MATERIAL INSPECTION AND RECEIVING REPORT

Applicable only to final inspection and acceptance for over and above repair of reparables where Seller will ship directly to the U.S. Government or to a foreign destination:

- (a) As specified by DFARS, Appendix F, Table 2, a copy of DD Forms 250 shall be forwarded to the following address:
  - (1) Forward the Government purchasing office copy to TBD.
  - (2) For shipments involving foreign Military Assistance Program (MAP), Grant Aid (GA), or Foreign Military Sales (FMS) requirements, an additional copy shall be sent to: TBD.
  - (3) Additional distribution of DD Forms 250 is to be made to the following addresses: Not Applicable TBD.
- (b) If delivery of MAP, GA, or FMS items to foreign destinations is required, the copies of DD Forms 250 required by DFARS, Appendix F, Table 2, Material Inspection and Receiving Report, Special Distribution, shall be forwarded to the "ship to" address designated in the contract.

# C. OZONE DEPLETING SUBSTANCES

The Seller shall notify the Buyer Purchasing Representative if any Class 1 Ozone depleting Substances (ODS) are used or anticipated to be used in the design, manufacture, test, operation, or maintenance of any system, subsystem, item component or process set forth in this Contract.

## D. SAFETY AND ACCIDENT PREVENTION

- (a) In performing work under this Contract on a Government installation, Seller shall
  - (1) Conform to the specific safety requirements established by this Contract;
  - (2) Comply with the safety rules of the Government installation that concern related activities not directly addressed in this contract;

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- (3) Take all reasonable steps and precautions to prevent accidents and preserve the health and safety of Seller, Buyer and Government personnel performing or in any way coming in contact with the performance of this contract; and
- (4) Take such additional immediate precautions as Buyer or the Contracting Officer under Buyer's Government contract may reasonably require for health and safety purposes.
- (b) Buyer may, by written notice to the Seller, direct Air Force Occupational Safety and Health Standards (AFOSH) and/or health/safety standards as may be required in the performance of this contract and any adjustments resulting from such direction will be in accordance with the article set forth in the General Terms and Conditions entitled "Changes"
- (c) Any violation of these safety rules and requirements, unless promptly corrected as directed by Buyer or the Contracting Officer, shall be grounds for termination of this Contract in accordance with the default provisions hereof.
- E. NOTIFICATION OF GOVERNMENT SECURITY ACTIVITY AND VISITOR GROUP SECURITY AGREEMENTS (Applies only work is performed on a Government installation)

This contract contains a DD Form 254, DOD Contract Security Classification Specification, and requires performance at a government location in the U.S. or overseas. Prior to beginning operations involving classified information on an installation identified on the DD Form 254, the Seller shall take the following actions:

- (1) At least thirty days prior to beginning operations, notify the security police activity shown in the distribution block of the DD Form 254 as to:
  - (a) The name, address, and telephone number of this contract company's representative and designated alternate in the U.S. or overseas area, as appropriate;
  - (b) The contract number and military contracting command;
  - (c) The highest classification category of defense information to which contractor employees will have access:
  - (d) The Air Force installations in the U.S. (in overseas areas, identify only the APO number(s)) where the contract work will be performed;
  - (e) The date Seller operations will begin on base in the U.S. or in the overseas area;
  - (f) The estimated completion date of operations on base in the U.S. or in the overseas area; and
  - (g) Any changes to information previously provided under this clause. This requirement is in addition to visit request procedures contained in DOD 5220.22-M, National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual.
- (2) Prior to beginning operations involving classified information on an installation identified on the DD Form 254 where the Seller is not required to have a facility security clearance, the Seller shall enter into a Visitor Group Security Agreement (or understanding) with the installation commander to ensure that the Seller's security procedures are properly integrated with those of the installation. As a minimum, the agreement shall identify the security actions that will be performed:
  - (a) By the installation for the Seller, such as providing storage and classified reproduction facilities, guard services, security forms, security inspections under DOD 5220.22-M, classified mail services, security badges, visitor control, and investigating security incidents; and
  - (b) Jointly by the Seller and the installation, such as packaging and addressing classified transmittals, security checks, internal security controls, and implementing emergency procedures to protect classified material.

## F. MAINTENANCE OF GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY

(1) The Contractor shall maintain the following items of GFP while in its possession and is authorized to use the MILSTRIP system to requisition parts from DoD supply sources in accordance with DoD 4000.25-1-M, Military Standard Requisitioning and Issue Procedures (MILSTRIP), in order to provide such maintenance:

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- (2) The Contractor's authorization to use the MILSTRIP system shall terminate on (insert date). The Contractor shall requisition only those items necessary for performance of this contract and shall return all excess items using normal MILSTRIP return procedures unless other instructions are provided by the Government.
- (3) The Contractor shall enter (insert code) as the project code in card columns 57-59 on DD Form 1348, DoD Single Line Item Requisition System Document, for all MILSTRIP requisitions submitted in support of this contract. In addition, the following fields shall be completed as follows: in card columns 45-50 of the DD Form 1348 as follows, enter a "Y" in column 45, the last digit of the contract year in column 46 and the last four characters of the contract number in columns 47-50 (if this field is already filled, use columns 71-76 or, alternately, the "REMARKS" section of the DD Form 1348); enter (insert code) as the advice code in columns 65-66; (insert code) as the signal code in column 51; and (insert code) as the fund code in columns 52-53. The Contractor shall use Requisition Priority Designators as assigned by the Contract Administration Office (CAO) for each MILSTRIP requisition submitted.
- (4) The Contractor shall submit all MILSTRIP requisitions to the CAO representative at the Contractor's plant. The CAO will approve or reject the Contractor's MILSTRIP requisition.
- (5) The Contractor may flow-down authorizations to use the MILSTRIP system to subcontractors(s) but only after prior written approval of the Contracting Officer, where upon the same requirements and restrictions contained in this contract will apply to the subcontractor(s).
- (6) Additional guidance may be found in AFM 67-1, Volume I, Part One or DoDI 4140.48.
- (7) Rejected or unavailable requisitioned items shall be added to Contractor-furnished items, in which event the Contractor shall promptly notify the Contracting Officer and the contract price, as appropriate, shall be subject to equitable adjustment.
