Therefore, Cost Information Other Than Cost or Pricing Data, IAW the format prescribed in FAR 15.408 (m) Table 15-2, is required for all negotiations after award of the contract. IAW FAR 15.403-1 (b0 (3) the submitted cost inforation is required for a "Commercial " item and will not be formally certified as "Cost or pricing Data" but will reflect the Contractor's best information at the date of the proposal.
