CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

1. FAR Clauses The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures (JUL 1995). Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.203-8 Cancellation, Rescission, and Recovery of Funds for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 1997). This clause applies to this contract if the Seller, its employees, officers, directors or agents participated personally and substantially in any part of the preparation of a proposal for this contract. The Seller shall indemnify Buyer for any and all losses suffered by the Buyer due to violations of the Act (as set forth in this clause) by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier.

52.203-10 Price or Fee Adjustment for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 1997).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold. If the Government reduces Buyer's price or fee for violations of the Act by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier, Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of the reduction.

52.203-11 Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (SEP 2007).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold.

52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (JUN 2003). This clause applies only if this Contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (c)(4) is modified to read as follows: "(c)(4) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor.

52.204-2 Security Requirements (AUG 1996). Changes clause means the changes clause of this contract. This clause applies only if access to classified material is required.

52.209-6 Protecting the Government's Interests When Subcontracting With Contractors Debarred, Suspended or Proposed for Debarment (JAN 2005). Applicable clause date is revised to (JUL 1995).

52.211-5 Material Requirements (AUG 2000). Any notice will be given to Buyer rather than the Contracting Officer.

52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements (SEP 1990). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.

52.215-2 Audit and Records - Negotiation (JUN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types: (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.

52.215-8 Order of Precedence--Uniform Contract Format (OCT 1997).

52.215-9 Changes or Additions to Make-or-Buy Program (OCT 1997).

52.215-10 Price Reduction for Defective Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. In subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a), insert "of this contract" after "price or cost." In Paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

52.215-11 Price Reduction for Defective Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" means "Government" or "Buyer." In Paragraph (e), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

52.215-12 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."

52.215-13 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (c) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."

52.215-14 Integrity of Unit Prices (OCT 1997).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold. This clause does not apply to construction or architect-engineer services under FAR Part 36; utility services under FAR Part 41; services where supplies are not required; commercial items; and petroleum products.

52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions (JAN 2004). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(g).

52.215-17 Waiver of Facilities Capital Cost of Money (OCT 1997).

52.215-18 Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Postretirement Benefits Other Than Pensions (PRB) (OCT 1997). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(j).

52.215-19 Notification of Ownership Changes (OCT 1997). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(k).

52.215-21 Requirement for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost and Pricing Data - Modifications (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.215-21 Requirement for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost and Pricing Data - Modifications Alternate III (OCT 1997).

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (OCT 2000).

52.219-9 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (JAN 2002). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. Seller shall adopt a subcontracting plan that complies with the requirements of this clause. In addition, Seller shall submit to Buyer Form X31162, Small and Small Disadvantaged Business and Women-Owned Small Business Subcontracting Plan Certificate of Compliance.

52.219-9 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (Deviation) (FEB 2009) Alternate II (OCT 2001).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. Seller shall adopt a subcontracting plan that complies with the requirements of this clause. In addition, Seller shall submit to Buyer Form X31162, Small and Small Disadvantaged Business and Women-Owned Small Business Subcontracting Plan Certificate of Compliance. In accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(iv), Seller agrees that it will submit the SF 294 and/or SSR using eSRS, in accordance with paragraph (l) of this clause.

52.222-1 Notice to the Government of Labor Disputes (FEB 1997). Contracting Officer shall mean Buyer.

52.222-6 Davis-Bacon Act (JUL 2005).

52.222-7 Withholding of Funds (FEB 1988).

52.222-10 Compliance With Copeland Act Requirements (FEB 1988).

52.222-11 Subcontracts (Labor Standards) (FEB 1988). Seller shall include this clause in its subcontracts and shall require such subcontractors to flow this clause to all lower tier subcontractors. The following FAR clauses are incorporated herein by this reference and made a part of this contract: 52.222-6 Davis Bacon Act; 52.222-7 Withholding of Funds; 52.222-8 Payrolls and Basic Records; 52.222-9 Apprentices and Trainees; 52.222-10 Subcontracts (Labor Standards); 52.222-12 Contract Termination - Debarment; 52.222-13 Compliance with Davis Bacon and Related Act Regulations; 52.222-14 Disputes Concerning Labor Standards; and 52.222-15 Certification of Eligibility.

52.222-12 Contract Termination-Debarment (FEB 1988).

52.222-13 Compliance With Davis-Bacon and Related Act Regulations (FEB 1988).

52.222-14 Disputes Concerning Labor Standards (FEB 1988).

52.222-15 Certification of Eligibility (FEB 1988).

52.222-20 Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act (DEC 1996). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.

52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (FEB 1999).

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (APR 2002).

52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (DEC 2001). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.

52.222-36 Affirmative Action For Workers With Disabilities (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$ 10,000.

52.222-37 Employment Reports on Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (DEC 2001). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.

52.222-41 Service Contract Act of 1965, As Amended (MAY 1989). This clause only applies to contracts which are subject to this act.

52.222-54 Employment Eligibility Verification (JAN 2009).

This clause applies to all subcontracts that (1) are for (i) commercial or noncommercial services (except for commercial services that are part of the purchase of a COTS item, or an item that would be a COTS item, but for minor modifications performed by the COTS provider and are normally provided for that COTS item), or (ii) construction; (2) has a value of more than \$3,000; and (3) includes work performed in the United States.

52.223-3 Hazardous Material Identification and Material Safety Data (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.

52.223-7 Notice of Radioactive Materials (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract involves (i) radioactive material requiring specific licensing under the regulations issued pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, as set forth in Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations, in effect on the date of this contract, or (ii) other radioactive material not requiring specific licensing in which the specific activity is greater than 0.002 microcuries per gram or the activity per item equals or exceeds 0.01 microcuries. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. In the blank in paragraph (a), insert "60 days."

52.223-11 Ozone Depleting Substances (MAY 2001).

52.223-13 Certification of Toxic Chemical Release Reporting (AUG 2003). Except for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, this clause applies to competitive procurements expected to exceed \$100,000 (including all options). If Seller is not subject to the Form R filing and reporting requirements, Seller shall inform Buyer which exemption or exemptions in subparagraph (b)(2) of this clause apply.

52.223-14 Toxic Chemical Release Reporting (AUG 2003). This clause applies only if this contract is not for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, was competitively awarded, and exceeds \$100,000 (including all options).

52.224-2 Privacy Act (APR 1984). This clause applies only if Seller is required to design, develop, or operate a system of records contemplated by this clause.

52.225-1 Buy American Act- Supplies (JUN 2003). This clause does not apply if this contract is placed under a Department of Defense contract.

52.225-5 Trade Agreements (NOV 2007). Applicable clause date is revised to (JAN 2004).

52.225-8 Duty-Free Entry (FEB 2000). This clause applies only if this contract identifies supplies to be afforded duty-free entry or if foreign supplies in excess of \$10,000 may be imported into the customs territory of the United States. For the purposes of this clause,

the blanks in paragraph (g)(3) are completed as follows: UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, Duty-free entry is claimed pursuant Section XXII, Chapter 98, Subchapter VIII, Item No. 9808.00.30 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States. Upon arrival of shipment at port of entry, the importer or authorized agent will notify Commander, Defense Contract Management Area Operations (DCMAO, New York, 201 Varick Street, New York, New York, 10014-4811, Attention DCRN-NCT) for execution of Customs Forms 7501, 7501-A, or 7506 and required duty free entry certificates.

52.225-13 Restrictions on Certain Foreign Purchases (DEC 2003).

52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (JUL 1995).

52.227-1 Authorization and Consent Alternate I (APR 1984).

52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement (AUG 1996). A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer". This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.227-9 Refund of Royalties (APR 1984). This clause applies only if the amount of royalties reported during negotiation of this contract exceeds \$250.

52.227-11 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Short Form) (JUN 1997). This clause only applies if this Contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

52.227-12 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Long Form) (JAN 1997). This clause only applies if this Contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is other than a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

52.227-14 Rights in Data--General (JUN 1987). This clause applies only if data will be produced, furnished or acquired under this contract.

52.227-14 Rights in Data--General Alternate III (JUN 1987).

52.227-14 Rights in Data--General Alternate V (JUN 1987).

52.227-16 Additional Data Requirements (JUN 1987). This clause applies only if this contract involves experimental, developmental, research, or demonstration work.

52.227-19 Commercial Computer Software - Restricted Rights (JUN 1987).

52.227-21 Technical Data Declaration, Revision, and Withholding of Payments-Major Systems (JAN 1997).

52.227-22 Major System-Minimum Rights (JUN 1987).

52.228-3 Workers' Compensation Insurance (Defense Base Act) (APR 1984).

52.228-5 Insurance - Work on a Government Installation (JAN 1997). Seller shall provide and maintain insurance as set forth in this contract.

52.229-8 Taxes-Foreign Cost Reimbursement Contracts (MAR 1990).

52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (NOV 1999). Add "Buyer and the" before "Contracting Officer" in

paragraph (f). This provision applies if clause H001, H002, or H004 is included in this contract.

52.237-2 Protection of Government Buildings, Equipment, and Vegetation (APR 1984). This clause applies only if work will be performed on a Government installation. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.237-7 Indemnification and Medical Liability Insurance (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract requires health care services. Seller shall provide evidence of insurance for itself and any of its subcontractors as required by this clause.

52.242-15 Stop-Work Order (AUG 1989). Change "90 days" and "30 days" to "100 days" and "20 days" respectively. The terms "Contracting Officer" and "Government" shall mean Buyer.

52.242-15 Alt I (AUG 1989)

52.244-5 Competition in Subcontracting (DEC 1996).

52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (APR 2003).

52.245-1 Government Property (JUN 2007).

This clause applies only if Government property is acquired or furnished for contract performance. "Government" shall mean Government throughout except the first time it appears in paragraph (g)(1) when "Government" shall mean the Government or the Buyer. Paragraph (h)(1) is deleted and replaced by the following: "Seller assumes the risk of, and shall be responsible for, any loss, damage, destruction, or theft of Government property upon its delivery to Seller as Government-furnished property. However, Seller is not responsible for reasonable wear and tear to Government Property or for Government property properly consumed in performing this contract." If the contract incorporates Boeing General Provision GP4, the Government-Owned Property article in GP4 is hereby deleted.

52.246-11 Higher-Level Contract Quality Requirement (FEB 1999).

52.247-67 Submission of Commercial Transportation Bills to the General Services Administration for Audit (JUN 1997).

52.248-1 Value Engineering (FEB 2000). The term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract is for \$100,000 or more. If Value Engineering Change Proposal is accepted by the Government, Seller's share will be 50% of the instant, concurrent and future contract net acquisition savings and collateral savings that Buyer receives from the Government. Seller's negotiated share of the net acquisition savings and collateral savings shall not reduce the Government's share of concurrent or future savings or collateral savings. Buyer's payments to Seller under this clause are conditioned upon Buyer's receipt of authorization for such payments from the Government.

52.248-1 Alt. I (APR 1984)

2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

252.203-7001 Prohibition on Persons Convicted of Fraud or Other Defense-Contract Related Felonies (excluding paragraph (g)) (MAR 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and does not apply to the purchase of commercial items or commercial components. "Contractor" and "contract" are not changed in paragraphs (a) and (b). In paragraph (e), "Government" shall mean Government or Buyer. In paragraph (f), "through the Buyer" is inserted after "Contracting Officer". Paragraph (g) is deleted and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Contracting Officer.

252.204-7000 Disclosure of Information (DEC 1991). Seller will submit requests for authorization to release through Buyer. Seller shall submit written requests to Buyer a minimum of 60 days prior to proposed date of release.

252.204-7008 Requirements for Contracts Involving Export-Controlled Items. (APR 2010).

252.204-7009 Requirements Regarding Potential Access to Export Controlled Items (JUL 2008). .

252.209-7000 Acquisition From Subcontractors Subject to On-site Inspection Under the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and does not apply to the purchase of commercial items or commercial components.

252.211-7000 Acquisition Streamlining (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$1 million.

252.211-7003 Item Identification and Valuation (AUG 2008). Seller shall comply with the unique item identification requirements of this clause for those subassemblies, components, and parts specified elsewhere in this contract. Such identification and marking shall be a high-capacity 2D machine readable code to comply with the version of MIL-STD-130, Identification Marking of U.S. Military Property, set forth elsewhere in this contract; or if not so stated, then the Seller shall comply with MIL-STD-130 N. The code may include, as space is available, linear bar code and human readable characters. Unless otherwise specified in Boeing product drawings or specifications, the seller may use either Construct #1 or Construct #2. The Seller shall not be required to furnish item valuations as set forth in this clause.

252.215-7000 Pricing Adjustments (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4.

252.219-7003 Small, Small Disadvantaged and Women-Owned Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts) (APR 1996). Except paragraph (g) which is hereby deleted.

252.222-7999 Additional Requirements and Responsibilities Restricting the Use of Mandatory Arbitration Agreements (DEVIATION) (FEB 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is in excess of \$1 million and uses Fiscal Year 2010 funds, and is not for the acquisition of commercial items or commercially available off-the-shelf items. Seller shall include and flowdown this clause in all covered subcontracts.

252.223-7001 Hazard Warning Labels (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.

252.223-7006 Prohibition on Storage and Disposal of Toxic and Hazardous Materials (APR 1993).

252.225-7001 Buy American Act and Balance of Payment Program (APR 2003).

252.225-7002 Qualifying Country Sources as Subcontractors (APR 2003).

252.225-7004 Reporting of Contract Performance Outside the United States (APR 2003). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and is not for commercial items, construction, ores, natural gases, utilities, petroleum products and crudes, timber (logs), or subsistence.

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (FEB 2003).

252.225-7013 Duty-Free Entry (JAN 2004). This clause applies if Seller is located in a qualifying country (as defined in DFARS Part 225.8) or if Seller is located in any other country and the estimated U.S. duty for the deliverable items will exceed \$200 per unit. Seller shall include the prime contract number on all shipping documents submitted to Customs for supplies for which duty-free entry is claimed pursuant to this clause.

252.225-7014 Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals (APR 2003).

252.225-7016 Restriction on Acquisition of Ball and Roller Bearings (APR 2003). This clause does not apply to the purchase of commercial items other than ball or roller bearings or to items which contain no ball or roller bearings..

252.225-7025 Restriction on Acquisition of Forgings (APR 2003). This clause applies only if this contract is for goods that contain restricted forging items per paragraphs (a) and (b) of the referenced clause.

252.225-7040 Contractor Personnel Authorized to Accompany U.S. Armed Forces Deployed Outside the United States (JUL 2009).

This clause, including this paragraph (q), applies only if, in performance of this contract, employees of Seller are authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States in (1) contingency operations; (2) humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (3) other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander.

252.225-7043 Antiterrorism/Force Protection Policy for Defense Contractors Outside the United States (MAR 2006). This clause applies only if this contract requires Seller to perform or travel outside the United States and Seller is not (i) a foreign government, (ii) a representative of a foreign government, or (iii) a foreign corporation wholly owned by a foreign government..

252.227-7013 Rights In Technical Data -- Noncommercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for noncommercial items under this contract.

252.227-7014 Rights In Noncommercial Computer Software And Noncommercial Computer Software Documentation (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of noncommercial computer software or noncommercial computer documentation may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7015 Technical Data -- Commercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for commercial items under this contract.

252.227-7016 Rights in Bid or Proposal Information (JUN 1995).

252.227-7027 Deferred Ordering of Technical Data or Computer Software (APR 1988). This clause applies only if technical data or computer software may be generated as part of the performance of this contract.

252.227-7030 Technical Data -- Withholding of Payment (MAR 2000). In this clause, "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

252.227-7036 Declaration of Technical Data Conformity (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required by this contract.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 1999). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required by this contract.

252.228-7001 Ground and Flight Risk (JUN 2010).

252.228-7005 Accident Reporting and Investigation Involving Aircraft, Missiles, and Space Launch Vehicles (DEC 1991).

252.231-7000 Supplemental Cost Principles (DEC 1991).

252.234-7001 Notice of Earned Value Management System (APR 2008). This clause applies only if 252.234-7002 is applicable.

252.234-7002 Earned Value Management System (APR 2008). This clause applies only if it is indicated elsewhere in this contract that Seller must use an earned value management system (EVMS).

252.235-7004 PROTECTION OF HUMAN SUBJECTS (JUL 2009).
