CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

H-7 Organizational Conflict of Interest.

- (a) The term "organizational conflict of interest" means that because of other activities or relationships with other persons, a person is unable to or potentially unable to render impartial assistance or advice to the Government, or the person's objectivity in performing the contract work is or might be otherwise impaired, or a person has an unfair competitive advantage. The term person includes a business organization.
- (b) The contractor warrants that, to the best of its knowledge and belief, it does not have any organizational conflict of interest, as defined in paragraph (a).
- (c) The contractor agrees that, if in the performance of this contract it discovers a potential organizational conflict of interest with respect to the contract, it shall make an immediate and full disclosure in writing to the Contracting Officer, which shall include a description of the actions which the contractor has taken or proposes to take to avoid, eliminate, or neutralize the conflict. In the event that the contractor does not disclose a known potential conflict to the Contracting Officer, the Government may terminate the contract for default.
- (d) If the contractor is directed by authorized Government personnel by written tasks or verbal directions (in program review or otherwise), to perform service which the contractor believes to constitute a potential organizational conflict of interest, the contractor is required to notify the Contracting Officer in writing of the nature of the conflict within ten (10) days after receipt of the Government directive. The Contracting Officer has the sole responsibility for determining whether a conflict does, in fact, exist. No effort shall be expended toward the performance of the services in question until this determination has been made or unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer.
- (e) The contractor hereby agrees that --
- (1) If the contractor provides system engineering and technical direction for a system under this contract, but does not have overall contractual responsibility for its development, integration, assembly, checkout, or production; then the contractor shall not: (i) later supply the system or any major component thereof; or (ii) be a subcontractor or consultant to a supplier of the system or any major

components thereof.

(2) If the contractor assists under this contract in the preparation of a Statement of Work to be used in competitively acquiring a system or services, or provides material leading directly, predictably, and without delay to a Statement of Work; the contractor shall not supply the system or major components thereof, nor the services unless: (i) it is the sole source; (ii) it has participated in the development and design work; or (iii) more than one contractor has been involved in preparing the Statement of Work.

- (3) In the performance of this contract, the contractor may have access to data which is proprietary to other companies. Therefore, the contractor agrees to protect such data from unauthorized use or disclosure so long as it remains proprietary. The contractor further agrees that it will not utilize such proprietary data in contracts for the supply of the systems, subsystems, or other components thereof, procured either through sealed bidding or negotiation, which results directly from the work performed under this contract. The contractor further agrees that it will not utilize such proprietary data in the performance of other contracts so long as the data remains proprietary. This provision is not intended to protect data furnished voluntarily by companies without limitations as to use, or data which falls into the public domain. This paragraph shall in no way limit those provisions stated elsewhere in the clause.
- (4) Such restraints as stated in this paragraph and elsewhere in the clause, with the exception of paragraph (e)(3), shall remain in effect until the Contracting Officer or his or her successor determines the organizational conflict of interest has satisfactorily been neutralized, mitigated, or eliminated.
- (5) The contractor is hereby warned that the foregoing situations are not the only ones which may constitute an organizational conflict of interest. The contractor is directed to FAR 9.5 for the principles of organizational conflict of interest.
- (f) The Government has the unilateral right to waive one or more of the provisions of this clause, on a case by case basis, if the contractor demonstrates to the Contracting Officer that the contractor can neutralize, mitigate or eliminate potential conflicts of interest.
- (g) Paragraphs (a) through (f) of this clause shall be included in all subcontracts at all levels.
