CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

- **1. FAR Clauses.** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract. This clause applies to this contract if the Seller, its employees, officers, directors or agents participated personally and substantially in any part of the preparation of a proposal for this contract. The Seller shall indemnify Buyer for any and all losses suffered by the Buyer due to violations of the Act (as set forth in this clause) by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier.
 - **52.203-10** Price or Fee Adjustment for Illegal or Improper Activity (Jan 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. If the Government reduces Buyer's price or fee for violations of the Act by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier, Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of the reduction.
 - **52.203-11** Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (Sep 2007). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
 - **52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions** (Sep 2007) . This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (g)(2) is modified to read as follows: "(g)(2) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor."

In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer.".
- **52.215-12 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data** (Oct 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "The Boeing Company or any of its wholly owned subsidiaries.".

- **52.215-21** Requirements for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost or Pricing Data Modifications (Oct 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

- **52.222-21** Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (Feb 1999).
- **52.222-26 Equal Opportunity** (Mar 2007).
- **52.222-35** Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (Sep 2006). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- **52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Workers With Disabilities** (Jun 1998) . This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$ 10,000.
- **52.222-37** Employment Reports on Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (Sep 2006). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- **52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons** (Apr 2007). In paragraph (d), the term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term "the Government" means Buyer. This clause applies if the contract includes the acquisition of services.
- **52.223-13** Certification of Toxic Chemical Release Reporting (Aug 2003). Except for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, this clause applies to competitive procurements expected to exceed \$100,000 (including all options). If Seller is not subject to the Form R filing and reporting requirements, Seller shall inform Buyer which exemption or exemptions in subparagraph (b)(2) of this clause apply.
- **52.223-14 Toxic Chemical Release Reporting (excluding subparagraph (e))** (Aug 2003). This clause applies only if this contract is not for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, was competitively awarded, and exceeds \$100,000 (including all options).

- 52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (Jul 1995), Alternate I (APR 1984).
- **52.227-11 Patent Rights Ownership by the Contractor** (Dec 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is a small business firm or nonprofit organization.
- **52.227-14 Rights in Data General** (Jun 1987) . This clause applies only if data will be produced, furnished or acquired under this contract.

This is applicable to this contract if it includes a "New Technology" clause or a "Patents Rights -- Retention by the Contract (Short Form)" clause.
- **18-52.242-73** NASA Contractor Financial Management Reporting (Nov 2004). This clause applies only if this contract is a cost-type, price redetermination or FPI contract. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative.
- **18-52.244-70** Geographic Participation in the Aerospace Program (Apr 1985). This clause applies only if this contract is for \$100,000 or more.
- **18-52.245-70** Acquisition of Centrally Reportable Equipment (Sep 2007). [excluding paragraph (b)(3)]. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. If the equipment is to be acquired as Special Test Equipment (STE), Seller shall submit the applicable request 75 days in advance of the date Seller intends to acquire the equipment. No later than 30 September of each year, Seller will provide Buyer a list of all property acquired under this clause. The list will include at a minimum: (1) part number; (2) serial number; (3) modification number, if any; (4) nomenclature; (5) acquisition cost; (6) acquisition date; and (7) the date of the prior year's list.
- **18-52.245-73 Financial Reporting of NASA Property in the Custody of Contractors** (Sep 2007) . Seller will submit annual reports to Buyer no later than October 15th.
- **3.** Commercial Items. If goods or services being procured under this contract are commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:
 - **52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns** (May 2004). This clause applies only if this contract offers further subcontracting opportunities. If this contract exceeds \$550,000 (\$1,000,000 for construction of any public facility) and Seller is not a small business concern, Seller must include 52.219-8 in lower tier subcontracts that offer subcontracting opportunities.
 - **52.222-26 Equal Opportunity** (Mar 2007).

- **52.222-39 Notification of Employee Rights Concerning Payment of Union Dues or Fees** (Dec 2004) . This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- **52.247-64** Preference for Privately-Owned U.S. Flag Commercial Vessels (Feb 2006) . In paragraph (C)(2) "20" and "30" are changed to 10 and 20 respectively.

4. Cost Accounting Standards.

(1) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H001). The version of FAR 52.230-2, Cost Accounting Standards, incorporated by clause H001 is the version dated April 1998.

5. The following prime contract special provisions apply to this purchase order:

A. SECRUITY PROGRAM/NON-U.S. CITIZEN EMPLOYEE ACCESS REQUIREMENTS (LaRC 52.204-91)(FEB 2007)

Access to the LaRC by non-U.S. citizen employees, including those in permanent resident alien status, shall be approved in accordance with NPR 1371.2A, "Requirements for Processing Requests for Access to NASA Installations or Facilities by Foreign Nationals or U.S. Citizens Who are Reps of Foreign Entities". Processing requires advance notice of a minimum of 20 days depending on the nationality of the non-U.S. citizen or foreign representative. Access authorization shall be for a maximum of one year and must be re-evaluated annually. Non-U.S. citizen employees or foreign representatives must be under escort at all times while on Center (by a NASA Civil Servant or permanently badged contractor) unless otherwise approved by the International Visitors Coordinator (IVC).

B. OBSERVATION OF REGULATIONS AND IDENTIFICATION OF CONTRACTOR'S EMPLOYEES (LaRC 52.211-104)(FEB 2007)

(a) Observation of Regulations—In performance of that part of the contract work which may be performed at Langley Research Center (LaRC) or other Government installations, the Contractor shall require its employees to observe the rules and regulations as prescribed by the authorities at LaRC or other installation including all

- (b) Identification Credentials—At all times while on LaRC property, the Contractor shall require its employees, subcontractors and agents to wear credentials issued by NASA LaRC. Contractors will be held accountable for these credentials, and may be required to validate its active employees on an annual basis with the NASA LaRC Security Office. Immediately upon employee termination or contract completion, badges shall be returned to the NASA LaRC Badge and Pass Office. It is agreed and understood that all NASA identification badges remain the property of NASA and the Government reserves the right to invalidate such badges at any time.
- (c) Employee Out Processing—The Contractor shall ensure that all employees who are terminated or no longer connected with work being performed under this contract are out processed through the LaRC Badge and Pass Office. Badges and keys must be accounted for and returned.
