CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below.

1. FAR Clauses The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

52.203-13 Contractor Code of Business Ethics and Conduct (APR 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is in excess of \$5,000,000 and has a period of performance of more than 120 days.

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (JAN 2011).

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (MAR 2007).

52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Veterans. (SEP 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is \$100,000 or more.

52.222-36 Affirmative Action For Workers With Disabilities (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

52.222-40 Notification of Employee Rights Under the National Labor Relations Act. (DEC 2010).

52.222-41 Service Contract Act of 1965 (NOV 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the Act.

52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons (FEB 2009). In paragraph (d), the term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term "the Government" means Buyer.

52.222-51 Exemption from Application of the Service Contract Act to Contracts for Maintenance, Calibration, or Repair of Certain Equipment--Requirements (NOV 2007). This clause applies only for exempt services under this contract.

52.222-53 Exemption From Application Of The Service Contract Act To Contracts For Certain Services-Requirements (FEB 2009). This clause applies to contracts for exempt services.

52.222-54 Employment Eligibility Verification (JAN 2009).

This clause applies to all subcontracts that (1) are for (i) commercial or noncommercial services (except for commercial services that are part of the purchase of a COTS item, or an item that would be a COTS item, but for minor modifications performed by the COTS provider and are normally provided for that COTS item), or (ii) construction; (2) has a value of more than \$3,000; and (3) includes work performed in the United States.

52.226-6 Promoting Excess Food Donation to Nonprofit Organizations. (MAR 2009). This clause applies only if this contract is in excess of \$25,000 and, under this contract, Seller will perform the provision, service, or sale of food in the United States.

52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels (FEB 2006). This clause does not apply if this contract is for the acquisition of commercial items unless (i) this contract is a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) items the Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Seller does not add value to the items when it subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b)

shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.

2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

252.225-7009 Restriction on Acquisition of Certain Articles Containing Specialty Metals (JAN 2011). Paragraph (d) of this clause is excluded. Paragraph (e) of this clause is included wherein "Government" means Buyer.

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (JUN 2010).

252.225-7039 Contractors Performing Private Security Functions (AUG 2011). In (c) (1), "Contracting Officer" and "Government" means Buyer. In (c) (3) and (c) (4), "Contracting Officer" means Buyer.

252.227-7013 Rights In Technical Data -- Noncommercial Items (FEB 2012).

252.227-7015 Technical Data -- Commercial Items (DEC 2011).

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 2011).

252.237-7010 Prohibition On Interrogation Of Detainees By Contractor Personnel (NOV 2010). This clause applies if the contract requires Seller's personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

252.237-7019 Training for Contractor Personnel Interacting with Detainees (SEP 2006). (c) *Subcontracts*. The Contractor shall include the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (c), in all subcontracts that may require subcontractor personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

252.247-7003 Pass-Through of Motor Carrier Fuel Surcharge Adjustment to the Cost Bearer (SEP 2010).

This clause applies if this contract is with a motor carrier, broker, or freight forwarder.

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAY 2002). This clause applies if this contract is for supplies that are of a type described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (d), "45 days" is changed to "60 days."

If this contract exceeds the simplified acquisition threshold, paragraphs (a)-(h) apply. In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer. If this contract is at or below the simplified acquisition threshold, paragraphs (f) and (g) are excluded. The simplified acquisition threshold is (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the simplified acquisition threshold.

252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). Contracting Officer and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), Contractor mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.
