CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

- **1. FAR Clauses** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.
 - **52.203-11** Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (SEP 2007). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
 - **52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions** (SEP 2007). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (g)(2) is modified to read as follows: "(g)(2) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor."
 - **52.204-2 Security Requirements** (AUG 1996). Changes clause means the changes clause of this contract. This clause applies only if access to classified material is required.
 - **52.211-5 Material Requirements** (AUG 2000). Any notice will be given to Buyer rather than the Contracting Officer.
 - **52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements** (APR 2008). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.
 - **52.215-2 Audit and Records Negotiation** (JUN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types: (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.
 - **52.215-10** Price Reduction for Defective Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. In subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a), insert "of this contract" after "price or cost." In Paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."
 - **52.215-11 Price Reduction for Defective Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications** (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" means "Government" or "Buyer." In Paragraph (e), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

- **52.215-12 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data** (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."
- **52.215-13** Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (c) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."
- **52.215-14 Integrity of Unit Prices** (OCT 1997). This clause applies except for contracts at or below \$100,000; construction or architect-engineer services under FAR Part 36; utility services under FAR Part 41; services where supplies are not required; commercial items; and petroleum products.
- **52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions** (OCT 2004). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(g).
- **52.215-18** Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Post-Retirement Benefits (PRB) Other Than Pensions (JUL 2005). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(j).
- **52.215-19 Notification of Ownership Changes** (OCT 1997). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(k).
- **52.215-21 Requirement for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost and Pricing Data - Modifications** (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (MAY 2004).
- **52.219-9 Small-Business Subcontracting Plan** (NOV 2007). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. Seller shall adopt a subcontracting plan that complies with the requirements of this clause. In addition, Seller shall submit to Buyer Form X31162, Small and Small Disadvantaged Business and Women-Owned Small Business Subcontracting Plan Certificate of Compliance.
- **52.222-20 Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act** (DEC 1996). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.
- 52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (FEB 1999).
- **52.222-26** Equal Opportunity (MAR 2007).
- **52.222-35** Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (SEP 2006). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- **52.222-36 Affirmative Action For Workers With Disabilities** (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$ 10,000.
- 52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons (AUG 2007). In paragraph (d), the term "Contracting Officer" means

Buyer, and in paragraph (e), the term "the Government" means Buyer.

- **52.223-7 Notice of Radioactive Materials** (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract involves (i) radioactive material requiring specific licensing under the regulations issued pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, as set forth in Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations, in effect on the date of this contract, or (ii) other radioactive material not requiring specific licensing in which the specific activity is greater than 0.002 microcuries per gram or the activity per item equals or exceeds 0.01 microcuries. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. In the blank in paragraph (a), insert "60 days."
- 52.223-11 Ozone Depleting Substances (MAY 2001).
- **52.223-13 Certification of Toxic Chemical Release Reporting** (AUG 2003). Except for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, this clause applies to competitive procurements expected to exceed \$100,000 (including all options). If Seller is not subject to the Form R filing and reporting requirements, Seller shall inform Buyer which exemption or exemptions in subparagraph (b)(2) of this clause apply.
- **52.223-14 Toxic Chemical Release Reporting** (AUG 2003). This clause applies only if this contract is not for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, was competitively awarded, and exceeds \$100,000 (including all options).
- **52.225-5 Trade Agreements** (AUG 2009).
- 52.225-13 Restriction on Certain Foreign Purchases (FEB 2006).
- 52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (DEC 2007).
- **52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement** (DEC 2007). A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer.
- 52.227-10 Filing of Patent Applications Classified Subject Matter (DEC 2007).
- **52.227-11 Patent Rights -- Ownership by the Contractor** (DEC 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is a small business firm or nonprofit organization.
- **52.230-6** Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (MAR 2008). Add "Buyer and the" before "CFAO" in paragraph (m). This provision applies if clause H001, H002, or H004 is included in this contract.
- 52.234-1 Industrial Resources Developed Under Defense Production Act Title III (DEC 1994).
- **52.242-15 Stop-Work Order** (AUG 1989). Change "90 days" and "30 days" to "100 days" and "20 days" respectively. The terms "Contracting Officer" and "Government" shall mean Buyer.
- **52.244-6** Subcontracts for Commercial Items (MAR 2007).
- **52.245-1 Government Property** (JUN 2007). This clause applies only if Government property is acquired or furnished for contract performance. The Government-Owned Property article in GP4 is hereby deleted.
- **52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels** (FEB 2006). This clause applies only if this contract is (i) a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) items the Contractor is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Contractor does not add value to the items when it

subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b) shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.

52.247-67 Submission of Transportation documents for Audit (FEB 2006).

52.248-1 Value Engineering (FEB 2000). The term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract is for \$100,000 or more. If Value Engineering Change Proposal is accepted by the Government, Seller's share will be 50% of the instant, concurrent and future contract net acquisition savings and collateral savings that Buyer receives from the Government. Seller's negotiated share of the net acquisition savings and collateral savings shall not reduce the Government's share of concurrent or future savings or collateral savings. Buyer's payments to Seller under this clause are conditioned upon Buyer's receipt of authorization for such payments from the Government.

2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

252.225-7006 QUARTERLY REPORTING OF ACTUAL CONTRACT PERFORMANCE OUTS IDE THE UNITED STATES (MAY 2007). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and is not for commercial items, construction, ores, natural gases, utilities, petroleum products and crudes, timber (logs), or subsistence.

252.225-7013 Duty Free Entry (OCT 2006). This clause applies if Seller is located in a qualifying country (as defined in DFARS Part 225.8) or if Seller is located in any other country and the estimated U.S. duty for the deliverable items will exceed \$200 per unit. Seller shall include the prime contract number on all shipping documents submitted to Customs for supplies for which duty-free entry is claimed pursuant to this clause. See Section 5 for the information required by paragraph (j)(3) of this clause.

252.225-7014 Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals (JUN 2005).

252.225-7016 Restriction on Acquisition of Ball and Roller Bearings (MAR 2006). This clause does not apply to the purchase of commercial items other than ball or roller bearings or to items which contain no ball or roller bearings.

252.225-7021 Trade Agreements (NOV 2008).

The Buy American Act restriction of this clause applies to the end items of the prime contract. If the items that you supply under this purchase contract are (1) components that are incorporated into such higher tier end items to be delivered under the prime contract, or (2) spare or replacement parts that must be acquired from the original foreign manufacturer or supplier, then your source of supply is not affected by this clause. However, in both cases you must report to the Buyer using a DD Form 2139 any foreign sources of supply for items that you deliver under this contract. This clause applies only if this contract requires Seller to perform or travel outside the United States and Seller is not (i) a foreign government, (ii) a representative of a foreign government, or (iii) a foreign corporation wholly owned by a foreign government...

252.226-7001 Utilization of Indian Organizations and Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises--DoD Contracts and Native Hawaiian Small Business Concerns (SEP 2004). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500.000.

252.227-7013 Rights In Technical Data -- Noncommercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for noncommercial items under this contract.

252.227-7014 Rights In Noncommercial Computer Software And Noncommercial Computer Software Documentation (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of noncommercial computer software or noncommercial computer documentation may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7019 Validation of Asserted Restrictions - Computer Software (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if computer software may be originated, developed, or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7030 Technical Data -- Withholding of Payment (MAR 2000). In this clause, "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 1999). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required by this contract.

252.227-7038 PATENT RIGHTS—OWNERS HIP BY THE CONTRACTOR (LARGE BUSINESS) (DEC 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is not a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

252.228-7005 Accident Reporting and Investigation Involving Aircraft, Missiles, and Space Launch Vehicles (DEC 1991).

252.231-7000 Supplemental Cost Principles (DEC 1991).

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAY 2002). This clause applies only if the supplies are of a type described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (d), "45 days" is changed to "60 days." In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer. If this contract is at or below \$100,000, paragraphs (f) and (g) are excluded.

252.249-7002 Notification Of Anticipated Contract Termination Or Reduction (DEC 1996). This clause applies only if this contact is \$500,000 or more. Seller will comply with the notice and flowdown requirements of paragraph (d)(2) of the referenced clause.

3. Commercial Items If goods or services being procured under this contract are commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (JAN 2007).

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAY 2002).

252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). "Contracting Officer" and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), "Contractor" mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

4. Cost Accounting Standards

52.230-2 Cost Accounting Standards (APR 1996). (1) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H001). The version of FAR 52.230-2, Cost Accounting Standards, incorporated by clause H001 is the version dated April 1996.

52.230-3 Disclosure and Consistency of Cost Accounting Practices (APR 1998). (2) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H002). The version of FAR 52.230-3, Disclosure and Consistency of Cost Accounting Practices, incorporated by clause H002 is the version dated April 1998.

5. Prime Contract Special Provisions The following prime contract special provisions apply to this purchase order

TBD NOTIFICATION OF DEBARMENT/S US PENSION AND EXPORT DATA CONTROL (AUG 2009). Seller shall provide immediate notice to Buyer in the event of being debarred suspended, or proposed for debarment by any Federal Agency during the performance of this contract.

- (1) For the purpose of this clause,
 - (A) Foreign person is any person who is not a citizen of the or lawfully admitted to the for permanent residence under the Immigration and Nationality Act, and includes foreign corporations, foreign organizations, and foreign governments;
 - (B) Foreign representative is anyone, regardless of nationality or citizenship, acting as an agent, representative, official, or employee of a foreign government, a foreign-owned or influenced firm, corporation, or person; and

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- (C) Foreign sources are those sources (vendors, subcontractors, and suppliers) owned and controlled by a foreign person.
- (2) Seller shall place a clause in subcontracts containing appropriate export control restrictions, set forth in this clause.
- (3) Nothing in this clause waives any requirement imposed by any other U.S. Government agency with respect to employment of foreign nationals or export-controlled data and information.
- (4) Equipment and technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract are controlled by the International Traffic in Arms Regulation (ITAR), 22 CFR Sections 121 through 128. An export license is required before assigning any foreign source to perform work under this contract or before granting access to foreign persons to any equipment and technical data generated or delivered during performance (see 22 CFR Section 125). Seller shall notify Buyer and obtain the written approval of Buyer prior to assigning or granting access to any work, equipment, or technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract to foreign persons or their representatives. This notification shall include the name and country of origin of the foreign person or representative, the specific work, equipment, or data to which the person will have access, and whether the foreign person is cleared to have access to technical data (DoD 5220.22-M, National Industrial Security Program Operating M anual (NISPOM)).

COUNTERFEIT PARTS . Counterfeit Parts

- (a) Definition. "Counterfeit Work" means Work that is or contains items deliberately misrepresented as having been designed and/or produced under an approved system or other acceptable method. The term also includes approved Work that has reached a design life limit or have been damaged beyond possible repair, but are altered and deliberately misrepresented as acceptable.
- (b) Prohibition. SELLER agrees and shall ensure that Counterfeit Work is not delivered to Boeing.
- (c) Prevention. SELLER shall only purchase products to be delivered or incorporated as Work to Boeing directly from the Original Component Manufacturer (OCM)/Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM), or through an OCM/OEM authorized distributor chain, Work shall not be acquired from independent distributors or brokers unless approved in advance in writing by Boeing.
- (d) Notification. SELLER shall immediately notify Boeing with the pertinent facts if SELLER becomes aware or suspects that it has furnished Counterfeit Work. When requested by Boeing, SELLER shall provide OCM/OEM documentation that authenticates traceability of the affected items to the applicable OCM/OEM.
- (d) Remedies. In the event that Work delivered under this Contract constitutes or includes Counterfeit Work, SELLER shall, at its expense, promptly replace such Counterfeit Work with genuine parts conforming to the requirements of this Contract. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Contract, SELLER shall be liable for all costs relating to the removal and replacement of Counterfeit Work, including without limitation Boeing's costs of removing Counterfeit Works, of reinserting replacement Work and of any testing necessitated by the reinstallation of Work after counterfeit parts have been exchanged. The remedies contained in this paragraph are in addition to any remedies Boeing may have at law, equity or under other provisions of this Contract.
- (e) Relationship to other provisions of this Contract. This clause applies in addition to any quality provision, specification, statement of work or other provision included in this Contract addressing the authenticity of Work. To the extent such provisions conflict with this clause, this clause prevails.
- (f) Flowdown. SELLER shall include paragraphs (a) through (d) this clause or equivalent provisions in lower tier subcontracts for the delivery of items that will be included in or furnished as Work to Boeing.
