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INDUSTRIAL SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

A. General Requirements:

- (1). Seller shall provide protection to government property to prevent damage during the period of time the property is under the control or possession of the seller.
- (2). Seller shall include a clause in all subcontracts to require subcontractors to comply with the safety provision of this contract, as applicable.
- (3). Seller shall insure that the safety designed into the system is not degraded by the repair methods or procedures, or changes initiated during work processes associated with this contract.
- (4). Seller shall comply with all safety provisions listed in the technical publications referenced in the work requirements of this contract.
- (5). Accident/incident reporting and investigation:
 - (a) Seller shall report promptly to buyer all available facts relating to each instance of damage to government property.
 - (b) When a major mishap involving government property in process occurs, seller shall immediately secure the accident scene and wreckage until released by the accident investigation authority as designated by the contracting alc safety office. Such release will be accomplished through the buyer. The accident scene shall be defined: at the seller's plant to be the damaged equipment and any tools and equipment directly related to the work in progress. On the government facility, the total launch facility (lf) or launch control facility (lcf) when under seller control.
 - (c) If the government elects to conduct an investigation of the accident, seller shall cooperate fully and assist the government personnel until the investigation is completed.
 - (d) Seller shall include a clause in each of his applicable subcontracts to require subcontractor's cooperation and assistance in accident reporting and investigation.

B. Specific Requirements:

Fire prevention and protection for government property shall be provided in accordance with paragraph 6-8, 6-8E, 6-8G, 6-8I, (with 6-8I(3) excluded), 6-9A, 6-9C and 12-18 of AFR 127-101.
