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military and civilian personnel and their families, to the extent such information can be made available prior to travel outside the United States; and

- (4) Obtain and comply with the most current antiterrorism/force protection guidance for Contractor and subcontractor personnel.
- (b) The requirements of this clause do not apply to any subcontractor that is--
- (1) A foreign government;
- (2) A representative of a foreign government; or
- (3) A foreign corporation wholly owned by a foreign government.
- (c) Information and guidance pertaining to DoD antiterrorism/force protection can be obtained from Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS), Code 24; telephone, DSN 228-9113 or commercial (202) 433-9113.
