## CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

- 1. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.
  - 52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
  - 52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures (excluding subparagraph (c) (1)) (JUL 1995). Buyer may withhold sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
  - 52.203-8 Cancellation, Rescission, and Recovery of Funds for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 1997). This clause applies to this contract if the Seller, its employees, officers, directors or agents participated personally and substantially in any part of the preparation of a proposal for this contract. The Seller shall indemnify Buyer for any and all losses suffered by the Buyer due to violations of the Act (as set forth in this clause) by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier.
  - 52.203-10 Price or Fee Adjustment for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. If the Government reduces Buyer's price or fee for violations of the Act by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier, Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of the reduction. In paragraph (d), the term "Government" shall mean Buyer.
  - 52.203-11 Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (SEP 2005). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
  - 52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (SEP 2005). This clause applies only if this Contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (c) (4) is modified to read as follows: "(c) (4) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor.
  - 52.204-2 Security Requirements (AUG 1996). "Changes clause" means the changes clause of this contract. This clause applies only if access to classified material is required.
  - 52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements (SEP 1990). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.
  - 52.215-2 Audit and Records Negotiation (JUN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types: (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.
  - 52.215-11 Price Reduction For Defective Cost or Pricing Data Modifications (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and is not otherwise exempt. "Contracting Officer" shall mean

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"Contracting Officer or Buyer." In subparagraph (d) (2) (i) (A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In subparagraph (d) (2) (ii) (B), "Government" means "Government" or "Buyer." In Paragraph (e), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

- 52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions (OCT 2004). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(g).
- 52.215-18 Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Postretirement Benefits Other Than Pensions (PRB) (JUL 2005). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(j).
- 52.215-19 Notification of Ownership Changes (OCT 1997). This Clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(k).
- 52.215-21 Requirements for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost or Pricing Data Modifications (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.215-21 Requirements for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost or Pricing Data Modifications (OCT 1997) ALTERNATIVE III (OCT 1997) Alt. III, Para c, Submit the cost portion of the proposal via the following electronic media" 'compact Disc containing only Microsoft Office 2003 or earlier documents.' This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (MAY 2004).
- 52.219-9 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (JUL 2005). In paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000. and Seller is not a small business concern.
- 52.222-1 Notice to Government of Labor Disputes (FEB 1997). "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (FEB 1999).
- 52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b) (1) through (11)) (APR 2002).
- 52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (DEC 2001). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.
- 52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Workers With Disabilities (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$ 10,000.
- 52.222-37 Employment Reports on Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (DEC 2001). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.
- 52.222-39 Notification of Employee Rights Concerning Payment of Union Dues or Fees (DEC 2004). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- 52.222-41 Service Contract Act of 1965, As Amended (JULY 2005). This clause only applies to contracts which are subject to this act.
- 52.224-2 Privacy Act (APR 1984). This clause applies only if Seller is required to design, develop, or operate a system of records contemplated by this clause.
- 52.225-13 Restrictions on Certain Foreign Purchases (FEB 2006).

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52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (JUL 1995).

- 52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement (AUG 1996). A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer". This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- 52.227-10 Filing of Patent Applications Classified Subject Matter (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract will involve access to classified information.
- 52.227-12 Patent Rights Retention by the Contractor (Long Form) (JAN 1997). Para. (1) insert agency instructions for communications 'TBD.' This clause only applies if this Contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is other than a small business firm or nonprofit organization.
- 52.228-3 Workers' Compensation Insurance (Defense Base Act) (APR 1984).
- 52.228-5 Insurance Work on a Government Installation (JAN 1997). Seller shall provide and maintain insurance as set forth in this contract.
- 52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (APR 2005). Add "Buyer and the" before "CFAO" in paragraph (m). This provision applies if Clause H001, H002 or H004 is included in Buyer's contract.
- 52.234-1 Industrial Resources Developed Under Defense Production Act Title III (DEC 1994).
- 52.237-2 Protection of Government Buildings, Equipment, and Vegetation (APR 1984). This clause applies only if work will be performed on a Government installation. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.242-15 Stop Work Order (AUG 1989). Change "90 days" and "30 days" to "100 days" and "20 days" respectively. The terms "Contracting Officer" and "Government" shall mean Buyer.
- 52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (FEB 2006)
- 52.247-63 Preference for U.S.-Flag Air Carriers (JUN 2003). This clause only applies if this contract involves international air transportation.

# {Use this Section 2 if the prime contract is with DoD}

- 2. DoD Contracts. If this Contract is placed under a Department of Defense Contract, the following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted. Unless otherwise provided, the clauses are those in effect as of the date of this contract.

  - 252.204-7000 Disclosure of Information (DEC 1991). Seller will submit requests for authorization to release through Buyer.
  - 252.211-7000 Acquisition Streamlining (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$1 million.
  - 252.215-7000 Pricing Adjustments (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000.

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252.225-7002 Qualifying Country Sources as Subcontractors (APR 2003)

252.225-7004 Report of Intended Performance Outside the United States and Canada - Submission After Award (JUN 2005). The term "Contractor" in paragraph (a) and the term "Contracting Officer" in paragraphs (b) and (c) means "Buyer." This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000.

252.225-7006 Quarterly Reporting of Actual Contract Performance Outside the United States (JUN 2005). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and is not for commercial items, construction, ores, natural gases, utilities, petroleum products and crudes, timber (logs), or subsistence.

252.225-7043 Antiterrorism/Force Protection for Defense Contractors Outside the United States (JUN 2005). Para. (d). Information and guidance pertaining to DoD antiterrorism/force protection can be obtained from" 'HQ/AFSFC/SFPT; telephone DSN 473-0927/0928 or commercial (210) 671-0927/0928.' This clause applies only if this contract requires Seller to perform or travel outside the United States and Seller is not (i) a foreign government, (ii) a representative of a foreign government, or (iii) a foreign corporation wholly owned by a foreign government.

252.226-7001 Utilization of Indian Organizations and Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises – DoD Contracts (SEP 2004). This clause applies if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and does not apply to the acquisition of commercial items/services as defined in FAR 2.101.

252.227-7013 Rights in Technical Data - Noncommercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for noncommercial items under this contract.

252.227-7016 Rights in Bid or Proposal Information (JUN 1995).

252.227-7030 Technical Data - Withholding of Payment (MAR 2000). In this clause, "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 1999). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required by this contract.

252.231-7000 Supplemental Cost Principles (DEC 1991)

252.232-7004 DoD Progress Payment Rates (OCT 2001). This clause applies if progress payments are authorized under this contract.

252.239-7000 Protection Against Compromising Emanations (JUN 2004). This clause applies only if computer equipment or systems that will be used to process classified information will be delivered under this contract.

252.239-7016 Telecommunications Security Equipment, Devices, Techniques and Services (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract requires securing telecommunications. Para (b), Location is 'TBC', Para (c), List can be obtained from 'TBD', Para (c) List and identify locations: 'TBD."

252.244-7000 Subcontracts for Commercial Items and Commercial Components (DoD Contracts) (NOV 2005).

252.245-7001 Reports of Government Property (MAY 1994). Seller will provide information that the Buyer may require to complete Buyer's annual report.

3. If goods or services being procured under this contract are commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:

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52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (OCT 2000). Include in all subcontracts that offer further subcontracting opportunities. If a subcontract (except subcontracts to small business concerns) exceeds \$500,000 (\$1,000,000 for construction of any public facility), Seller and any lower tier subcontractor must include 52.219-8 in lower tier subcontracts that offer subcontracting opportunities.

- 52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b) (1) through (11)) (APR 2002).
- 52.222-35 Affirmative Action for Special Disabled and Vietnam Era Veterans (Dec 2001). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.
- 52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Handicapped Workers (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.
- 52.222-39 Notification of Employee Rights Concerning Payment of Union Dues or Fees (DEC 2004). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.
- 52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels (APR 2003). This clause only applies if this contract is (i) a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) Items the Contractor is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Contractor does not add value to the items when it subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b) shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.
- 252.225-7014, Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals (APR 2003), Alternate I (APR 2003).
- 252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and are a type of supplies described in paragraph (b) (2) of this clause. In paragraph (c), "45 days" is changed to "60 days". In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer.
- 252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). "Contracting Officer" and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), "Contractor" mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

#### 4. Cost Accounting Standards

- (1) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H001). The version of FAR 52.230-2, Cost Accounting Standards, incorporated by clause H001 is the version dated April 1998.
- 5. The following prime contract special provisions apply to this purchase order:

# A. NOTIFICATION OF DEBARMENT/SUSPENSION STATUS

Seller shall provide immediate notice to Buyer in the event of being debarred suspended, or proposed for debarment by any Federal Agency during the performance of this Contract.

#### B. EXPORT CONTROLLED DATA RESTRICTIONS

(1) For the purpose of this clause,

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- (A) Foreign person is any person who is not a citizen of the U.S. or lawfully admitted to the U.S. for permanent residence under the Immigration and Nationality Act, and includes foreign corporations, foreign organizations, and foreign governments;
- (B) Foreign representative is anyone, regardless of nationality or citizenship, acting as an agent, representative, official, or employee of a foreign government, a foreign-owned or influenced firm, corporation, or person; and
- (C) Foreign sources are those sources (vendors, subcontractors, and suppliers) owned and controlled by a foreign person.
- (2) Seller shall place a clause in subcontracts containing appropriate export control restrictions, set forth in this clause.
- (3) Nothing in this clause waives any requirement imposed by any other U.S. Government agency with respect to employment of foreign nationals or export-controlled data and information.
- (4) Equipment and technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract are controlled by the International Traffic in Arms Regulation (ITAR), 22 CFR Sections 121 through 128. An export license is required before assigning any foreign source to perform work under this contract or before granting access to foreign persons to any equipment and technical data generated or delivered during performance (see 22 CFR Section 125). Seller shall notify Buyer and obtain the written approval of Buyer prior to assigning or granting access to any work, equipment, or technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract to foreign persons or their representatives. This notification shall include the name and country of origin of the foreign person or representative, the specific work, equipment, or data to which the person will have access, and whether the foreign person is cleared to have access to technical data (DoD 5220.22-M, National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM)).

# C. AIR FORCE MATERIEL COMMAND FEDERAL ACQUISITION REGULATION SUPPLEMENT CONTRACT CLAUSES

5352.227-9000 Export-Controlled Data Restrictions. (AFMC) (JULY 1997).

## D. FOREIGN NATIONALS - FOREIGN SOURCES

- (1) For the purposes of this clause,
  - (A) Foreign nationals are those persons not citizens of, not nationals of, or resident/immigrant aliens to, the United States;
  - (B) Foreign representative is anyone, regardless of nationality or citizenship, acting as an agent, representative, official, or employee of a foreign government, a foreign-owned or influenced firm, corporation, or person; and
  - (C) Foreign sources are those sources (vendors, subcontractors, and suppliers) not owned and controlled by citizens or immigrant aliens of the United States.
- (2) Nothing in this clause is intended to waive any requirement imposed by any other U.S. Government agency with respect to employment of foreign nationals or export-controlled data and information.
- (3) Seller acknowledges that equipment and technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract is controlled by the International Traffic in Arms Regulation (ITAR), 22 CFR Sections 121 through 128, and require an export license before assigning any foreign national to perform work under this contract or before granting access to foreign nationals to any equipment and technical data generated or delivered in performance of this contract (see 22 CFR Section 125). Seller agrees to notify and obtain the written approval of Buyer prior to assigning or granting access to any work, equipment, or technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract to foreign nationals or their representatives. This notification will include the name and country of origin of the foreign national or representative, the specific work, equipment, or data to which the person will have access, and whether the foreign national is

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cleared to have access to technical data (DoD 5220.22-M, National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM)).

# E. PROPRIETARY INFORMATION/LICENSE/DATA RIGHTS (MAR 2006)

- 1. "Proprietary Data" shall be that information, data, or material in oral or written form which is identified to the Government as proprietary at the time of disclosure.
- (a) Information data or material claimed to be or embody the proprietary and/or trade secret information of the contractor or any subcontractor, and which is not information, data or material formally delivered or required to be delivered or furnished under this contract, but which is nevertheless disclosed to the Government, may be marked as "Proprietary Data" or otherwise as appropriate. Such markings must specifically identify the entity claming the data as proprietary or trade secret. Any such information, data or material claimed to be proprietary or trade secret data which is disclosed orally must be placed in written form with appropriate markings within 30 days of its disclosure and provided to the Government. The Government will respect such proprietary markings on information, data or material not formally delivered or required to be delivered or furnished under this contract and will restrict disclosure of such information, data or material according to the terms of the prop markings or, if the information data or material is marked only as prop data will restrict disclosure to only those employees in the relevant organization within the Government who have a "need to know" the pro data in connection with this contract. The Government will exercise reasonable precautions to ensure that such employees do not make unauthorized disclosure or use not contemplated by this contract. The foregoing shall not apply to any information which is or comes into the public domain, or is obtained or developed independently and without violation of the contract.
- (b) Information, data or material claimed to be proprietary and/or trade secret information of the contractor or any subcontractor, and which is information, data or material formally delivered or required to be delivered under this contract, shall be marked in accordance with the provisions of DFARS 252.227-7015. In accordance with DFARS 227.7102, et seq, contractor and subcontractors shall be permitted to mark Proprietary Data in accordance with its commercial practices and appropriate legal requirements. The contractor and subcontractors, as the case may apply, shall retain all right, title and ownership to all intellectual property and related intellectual property rights (existing and/or new), for example, inventions and data, and related patents, trade secrets, and copyrights, resulting from work performed under this contract or any subcontract. The contractor and subcontractor, as the case may apply, shall also retain all right, title, and interest to simulation service hardware.
- 2. This contract does not grant any license to the Government in any intellectual property or related intellectual property rights now or later owned or controlled by the contractor or subcontractor unless that license is expressly made a part of this contract. Nothing contained in the contract shall prevent or limit the contractor or subcontractor from manufacturing, using, selling or licensing products, associated items, or data anywhere in the world. No data, information or material other than specifically identified in the contract as a deliverable item will be formally delivered or considered furnished under this contract.
