

Part Modification and Re-Identification (Variable)

1. Modification and Re-Identification. Seller shall modify the applicable item(s) from Part Number [_____] and, as applicable, National Stock Number (NSN) [_____] to Part Number [_____] and, as applicable, NSN [_____]. Such modification and re-identification shall be performed strictly in accordance with all applicable drawings, specifications, and engineering requirements.
2. Traceability. Seller shall maintain complete traceability for all affected item(s), including, as applicable, preservation and transfer of lot, batch, work order, inspection, certification, and source documentation sufficient to establish full traceability from the original part number to the re-identified part number.
3. Serialization; Duplicate Serial Numbers. Where applicable, Seller shall maintain serialization controls for each affected unit and shall preserve the integrity of all serialized records, markings, and associated data such that each serialized item can be traced from the original part number to the re-identified part number without loss of identity or history. In the event a duplicate serial number is identified, Seller shall promptly notify Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative for direction. When establishing a new configuration, Seller shall continue serialization sequencing beginning with the next available serial number and shall not restart, reuse, or duplicate serial numbers unless expressly authorized in writing by Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative.
4. Supporting Documentation. Unless otherwise authorized in writing by Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative, no other changes to form, fit, function, configuration, material, process, or performance are permitted. Seller shall provide all supporting documentation reasonably requested by Buyer to provide evidence of compliance with the Purchase Contract.
